Scope

The European Journal of Jewish Studies (EJJS) is the journal of the European Association for Jewish Studies (EAJS). Its main purpose is to publish high-quality research articles, essays and shorter contributions on all aspects of Jewish studies. Submissions are all double blind peer-reviewed. Additionally, *EJJS* seeks to inform its readers on current developments in Jewish studies: it carries comprehensive review-essays on specific topics, trends and debated questions, as well as regular book-reviews. A further section carries reports on conferences, symposia, and descriptions of research projects in every area of Jewish Studies.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

Submission of an article for publication in any of Brills' journals implies the following:

- 1. All authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the iournal.
- 2. The contents of the manuscript have been tacitly or explicitly approved by the responsible authorities where the research was carried out.
- 3. The manuscript has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language, except as an abstract, part of a published lecture or academic thesis.
- 4. The manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal.
- 5. If accepted, the author agrees to transfer copyright to BRILL and the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any form, in English or any other language, without prior written consent of the Publisher.
- 6. If the submission includes figures, tables, or large sections of text that have been published previously, the author has obtained written permission from the original copyright owner(s) to reproduce these items in the current manuscript in both the online and print publications of the journal. Submission

Double-blinded Peer Review

EJJS uses a double-blind peer review system, which means that manuscript author(s) do not know who the reviewers are, and that reviewers do not know the names of the author(s). When you submit your article, please submit a separate title page which includes the full title of the manuscript plus the names and complete contact details of all authors. This page will not be accessible to the referees. All other files (manuscript, figures, tables, etc.) should not contain any information concerning author names, institutions, etc. The names of these files should also be anonymized.

Non-Roman Scripts

Ideally all diacritics should be in Unicode.

For writers unfamiliar with Unicode, all characters that do not appear in the standard Roman alphabet (i.e., accented letters, diacritical marks) should be very plainly identified.

If your article contains non-Roman scripts (e.g., Greek, Hebrew) or diacritics please also submit a pdf file in which all non-Roman characters are displayed correctly.

An author's priority should be consistency; transliteration of words and proper names in Greek, Arabic, Hebrew, etc., should be consistent throughout

Submission Requirements

Language

Manuscripts will be accepted in English, French or German. Spelling in English may be either British or American. Spelling in the language used should be consistent throughout. In general, please consult *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 16th ed. (Chicago: University of Chicago Press 2010; also available online at chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html for guidance. For French or German, authors should please adhere to the style commonly applied in scholarly literature.

Manuscript Structure

Wide margins of at least 2.5 cm (1 inch) are to be left on all edges of the page. All parts must be double-spaced and numbered consecutively.

The first page of the manuscript should carry the full title of the article and the name of the author, followed by the abstract.

The remaining manuscript should be arranged in the following sequence: main article (with footnotes), bibliography or reading list (if any), appendices (if any), figure captions (if any), tables (if any), and figures. Acknowledgements should be addressed as a non-numbered footnote which will appear before the first footnote.

Abstract and Keywords

Full length articles should contain a short abstract of 100 words in English. The abstract should give a brief summary of the article, an outline of its argumentation, or sum up the points discussed. There should also be 3-8 keywords.

Footnotes

Notes should be numbered consecutively throughout the text and follow any punctuation marks, such as a period or comma, within the text. References should be included within the notes (but any Reading List or Bibliography can be presented as the final section of the paper). Take care as to ensure that each footnote reference appears in the appropriate position in the text.

Italics

Please italicize matter that is intended to be italicized.

Quotation Marks

Direct quotations of fewer than twenty-five words should be enclosed in double quotation marks ("") and run on in the text. Double quotation marks should also be used for titles of articles from journals and reference works.

Single quotation marks ('') are used to enclose words and phrases within double quotation marks.

Block Quotations

Larger sections of quoted text (i.e. anything over twenty-five words) should be set off from other text by adding a blank line above and below, and indenting the entire quotation 1.5 inches from the left. These larger sections, or block quotations, are not enclosed in quotation marks.

Publication

Proofs

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to the each author by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. Alterations to the original manuscript at this stage will result in considerable delay in publication and, therefore, are not accepted unless charged to the author.

Proofs should be returned within one week of receipt. Authors' alterations in excess of 10% of the original composition cost will be charged to authors.

E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to the corresponding author for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO green publisher, which means that authors are allowed to post the pdf post-print version of their articles on their own personal websites free of charge and they can show the article exactly as it appears in print. The institute employing the author is allowed to post the post-refereed, but pre-print version of articles free of charge on its repository. The post-refereed, pre-print version means the final accepted version of the manuscript before typesetting.

Authors of articles receive one copy of the issue in which their article appears.

Consent to Publish

Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the Consent to Publish which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

Open Access

In case the author wishes to publish the article in Open Access he/she can choose the Brill Open option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special Brill Open Consent to Publish.
