

Instructions to Authors

Please submit your manuscript to the Editor most closely associated with the topic discussed, in case of doubt to one of the Managing Editors. Manuscripts should be sent as paper versions (hardcopy) and in duplicate (one copy is for the referee). If possible an electronic file (in DVI, PDF or PS format, but not in TEX) should be sent as well, either on disk and enclosed with the manuscript or separately per e-mail.

Electronic submission of manuscripts is encouraged. Please send your electronic manuscript as a single PDF (also DVI or PS is accepted) together with an e-mail to monatshefte.mathematik@univie.ac.at. Please prepare the content of your paper in exactly the same way as for conventional submissions (following the Instructions to Authors) ensuring that all of your illustrations, tables etc. are included in a single PDF file with the main text. Half-tone figures in the PDF file should be < 300 dpi to keep the file at a size suitable for sending by e-mail for reviewing. Please try to ensure that the size of your file does not exceed 1 MB.

Name the file xxx.pdf, where xxx is the surname of the first author (no more than 15 characters, no spaces). When you make subsequent submission to the system, please add increasing digits to the end of the file names.

In the e-mail message sent together with the PDF file please indicate who of the editors should handle your paper and to whom of the authors correspondence should be directed.

Preparation of manuscripts. Authors are encouraged to use standard LaTeX 2.09 or LaTeX 2_ε under `\documentstyle{class}[12pt]{article}`. No stylefiles should be used. The following standard packages may be used: `amsmath`, `amsmath`, `amssymb`, `latexsym`.

No personal (re)definitions (macros) should be used for features available in standard LaTeX. Additionally, enlarged and well-reproducible hard copies of figures must be submitted by postal mail. The submitted LaTeX file must run under a standard LaTeX compiler and produce the complete manuscript.

1. Manuscripts should be typed on one side of the paper only in doubleline spacing with wide margins. Text pages should be numbered consecutively.
2. Each paper should be preceded by an **abstract**. The first page of the paper should contain a list of **key words** and the **2000 Mathematics Subject Classification**.
3. Formulae which should be emphasized must be numbered on the right-hand side of the page in arabic numerals in parentheses.
4. References, numbered consecutively and arranged in alphabetical order, should be listed at the end of the paper. Citations in the text should be given by numbers in square brackets. For the desired **format of references**, see the examples given below:

5. Footnotes which do not belong to the heading of the paper should be numbered consecutively.
6. In line drawings all lines should be of uniform thickness (minimum 0.5 points). All labelling should be of professional quality and uniform dimensions (ideal final height 2 mm). Figures should be saved individually in EPS format and submitted together with the TeX file.
7. The running head (condensed title) should not exceed 67 letters, including spaces. If the title of the paper is very long the author is requested kindly to state an adequate condensation of it on the first page of the manuscript.

Submission of the final version in electronic form.

After you have carried out all final revisions and have been notified of acceptance by the Managing Editor, you will be asked to send the final electronic version to the publisher. For this purpose, please follow carefully the instructions given by the Managing Editor in his acceptance notice.

Important: Make sure that you send a printout of the final version of your paper to the Managing Editor and that it is identical in content with the electronic version.

Electronic files sent by e-mail (as attachments) should always be identified by the name of the journal, the publisher's manuscript number (given in the Managing Editor's acceptance notice) and the name of the first author. Diskettes sent by post should carry an identifying label that contains the following information: Monatshefte fuer Mathematik, Manuscript number, Author(s).

Springer-Verlag will not accept disks without accompanying printouts that exactly match the files on the disk. Disks that are not translatable or economical to process will not be used. The publisher reserves the right not to use the disk.

Proofs and Offprints. Page proofs will be sent to the authors as PDFs. They should be carefully corrected and returned to the publisher as soon as possible. Misprints only should be corrected, and no changes of contents or style should be made on the page proofs. Costs caused by changes or revisions in the page proofs – other than those resulting from printer's errors – exceeding 10 per cent the typesetting costs may be charged to the author.

Springer will supply the corresponding author with 100 offprints of each paper free of charge. Additional offprints may be ordered at cost price. A price list and an order form will be sent with the proofs. The filled-in order form should accompany the corrected proofs when they are returned.
