## Instructions for authors

*Primates* publishes original and review articles, short communications, notes, book reviews, and other information on all aspects of primatology. Anyone involved in primate research may contribute.

Papers must present scientific results that are essentially new and that have not been submitted for publication or published elsewhere. Authors should submit four copies of their manuscript to:

All manuscripts are subject to peer review and accepted papers will be copy edited. Manuscripts must be written in English and typed in double-line spacing with 3-cm margins; lines should be numbered. Authors whose first language is not English are urged to have their manuscript read by a colleague who is a native English speaker and is familiar with their field of work before submitting the paper.

**Page limits and excess charges.** Contributors are requested to write as concisely as possible and the paper should not normally exceed 10 printed pages (about 30 typescript pages), including tables, figures, and reference list. The Editorial Board reserves the right to charge authors for the cost of any page in excess of 10 printed pages per article, at a rate of Japanese Yen 20,000 per excess page. Short communications should not normally exceed two printed pages (about six typescript pages).

Manuscripts must be accompanied by the "Copyright Transfer Statement". The form is regularly published in this journal and can also be downloaded from Springer's server (<http://link.springer.de/journals/primates/>).

Authors transfer the copyright to their articles to the Japan Monkey Centre and Springer-Verlag effective when the articles are accepted for publication. The copyright covers the exclusive and unlimited rights to reproduce and distribute an article in any form of reproduction (printing, electronic media, or any other form); the copyright also covers translation rights for all languages and countries. For U.S. authors, the copyright is transferred to the extent transferable.

**Manuscripts in electronic form.** After acceptance please send the electronic version of your manuscript to the Editorial Office. Please follow the technical instructions for manuscripts and illustrations in electronic form.

**Manuscripts.** Please organize your manuscript as follows:

- Title page (including all authors' full name; title of paper; affiliations of all authors; address of corresponding author including e-mail address, phone and fax number).
- Abstract (no more than 300 words)
- 3-5 key words

- Text of the paper divided into following sections: Introduction; Methods; Results; Discussion; Acknowledgments; References; tables; figure legends

When animals are used for experimentation, authors will be required to state at the end of the acknowledgments that they have complied with the ethical standards in the treatment of their animals with the guidelines laid down by the Primate Society of Japan, NIH (US), EC Guide for animal experiments or other equivalent guidelines; as well as with specific national laws where applicable.

**Footnotes** should be kept to a minimum, placed at the foot of the page to which they apply, and numbered consecutively throughout the paper.

**Genus and species names** should be in italics. The common names of animals should not be capitalized.

**SI units** should be used throughout except where non-SI units are more common.

**Abbreviations** should be defined at first mention in the abstract and again in the main body of the text and used consistently thereafter.

**Literature citations in the text** should indicate the author's surname with the year of publication.

**References at the end of the paper** should be listed in alphabetical order by the first author's name:

*Journal papers:* name(s) and initial(s) of all authors; year; full title of article; journal title abbreviated in accordance with international practice; volume number; first and last page numbers:

If available the Digital Object Identifier (DOI) of the cited literature should be added at the end of the reference in question.

**Tables and figures** must be mentioned in the text and should be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals. Figure parts should be identified by lower-case roman letters.

Tables should be typed on a separate page together with a clear descriptive title.

Figures should be kept to the minimum needed to clarify the text. They should be submitted on separate sheets, each bearing the figure number and the author's name. Legends should be placed at the end of the text.

Figures should match the size of either the column width (8.6 cm) or the printed area (17.6 × 23.6 cm). Magnification should be indicated by scale bars.

**Line drawings.** Please submit good-quality prints. The inscriptions should be clearly legible. Capital letters should be about 2 mm high in the final version.

**Half-tone illustrations.** Please submit well-contrasted photographic prints with the top indicated on the back.

**Color illustrations** will be accepted; however, authors will be expected to make a contribution towards the additional costs (¥110 000 for the first and ¥60 000 for each additional page).

**Illustrations prepared in digital form** must be in accordance with the technical instructions for manuscripts and illustrations in electronic form. Any extra expenses incurred for perfecting incomplete illustrations will be charged to the author.

**Electronic supplementary material (ESM).** Data such as black-and-white or color illustrations, large tables, animations, video clips, or sound recordings that are not essential for the understanding of a printed article but are of interest can be published free of charge to subscribers on Springer's server (<http://link.springer.de/journals/primates/>). After acceptance by the journal's editors the data will be supplied as received from the author. In the printed article, full reference will be given to the ESM and vice versa. For details of acceptable formats, consult the special instructions.

The corresponding author will be given one complimentary copy. Orders for **offprints** can be placed by returning the order form with the corrected proofs.

The manuscripts and the figures will not normally be returned; however, figures will be returned to authors on request after the paper has been published.
