

Instructions for Authors

Neues Jahrbuch für Mineralogie provides information on the progress of mineralogy in its widest sense including crystallography, petrology, geochemistry and the science of mineral deposits and is indexed in Science Citation Index and Current Contents.

New scientific findings and thorough detailed studies are emerging at an ever increasing rate. All papers will therefore be published with the least possible delay within about 6-8 months after having been accepted by the Editor in charge.

All manuscripts are subject to peer-review.

Submission of papers

Three hard copies and all data of each manuscript (including tables and figures) but with only 1 set of original figures (photographs on white high-gloss paper and, if necessary, with a scale bar on each picture; figure legends on (a) separate sheet(s)) should be submitted to the chief editor:

For the review process submission of manuscripts in .pdf-format is acceptable; final files have to be submitted in the format(s) given above.

Submission of a manuscript for publication in the Neues Jahrbuch für Mineralogie is considered binding assurance that this work has not been and will not be published elsewhere in this form and length.

Page charges are not expected.

Copyright

With acceptance and publication of a manuscript the exclusive copyright for every language and country is transferred to the publishers. The copyright covers the exclusive rights to reproduce and distribute the article including reprints, microfilm or any other reproduction and translations.

Manuscript Structure and Layout

Manuscripts should be written in English. If manuscripts exceed 25 printed pages please contact the editor prior to submission. They must be ready for printing; this means prepared by word processor or typewritten, with double-spaced lines, on one side of the paper and paginated. To avoid confusion with spacing, block-text and right-justification should be avoided.

Please structure the manuscripts in the following way:

Title page, abstracts, key words, text, acknowledgements, references, tables, figure captions and figures.

The **title page** contains title, name of authors with first name given in full. Non English language papers must contain an English translation of the title and the captions.

A short **English abstract** is placed after the title.

At the end of the abstract the authors should propose up to ten **key words**.

A short paragraph mentioning and, if necessary, explaining, the **instrumental equipment** and/or methods applied to obtain the results of the investigations, should be included in the paper. Use the International System of Units (SI).

The full **addresses** of all authors should be quoted at the end of the paper.

Illustrations and Data

All illustrations must be labelled with the authors' names and the figure numbers. They will be printed within the text and should be numbered consecutively.

Figures that need special layout, such as side by side (or over and under) for direct comparative purposes should be marked as such.

Files of the manuscript, the figures and the graphs should meet the following requirements:

Text preferable written with MS-word (please indicate software version); all fonts embedded. You may underline words to be printed in *italics* or double-underline words for **boldface** (titles, sub-titles, volume numbers in references). Dash-underlining signifies SMALL CAPS (for authors' names), they must not be underlined, however, if they have already been written in capitals or boldface.

Please do not use pervasive capitals for titles, headlines and section headings.

Figures and graphs: tif- or eps-files, (in exceptional cases jpeg-files may be used) minimum 600 dpi. Please ensure to embed all fonts when submitting eps-files.

For adequate documentation of **powder X-ray diffraction data**, please follow the procedures given in Acta Crystallographica A 39, 174-186, Appendix III.

Citation

When abbreviating journal titles, authors are requested to use, if possible, the German standards for journal abbreviations. DIN 1502 or be abbreviated in accordance with international practice (as stated in the rules of "Chemical Abstracts").

For example:

STRECKEISEN, A.L. (1967): Classification and Nomenclature of Igneous Rocks (Final Report of an Inquiry). – N. Jb. Miner. Abh. **104**: 114-240.

STRUNZ H. & NICKEL, E. H. (2001): Strunz Mineralogical Tables: – 9th Ed., Schweizerbart'sche Verlagsbuchhandlung, Stuttgart, Germany, 870 pp.

All publications referred to in the text of the paper must be included in the reference list.

Proofreading

After acceptance of their papers, authors (the first-named author for multi-author-papers) will receive two sets of page proofs prior to final printing. In order to speed publication, we request that one set of the corrected page proofs is returned immediately to the publishers. In cases where the author is prevented from making corrections, he should appoint a representative to check the proofs. If the page proofs are not returned in time, the paper will be published exactly as it appears in the uncorrected page proofs.

Neither formal alterations nor other changes should be included in the proofs. Authors will be charged for any alterations which they make to a proof unless they are corrections of printer's errors.

Reprints

Authors will receive 50 reprints free of charge; additional reprints can be ordered at cost.

Online Access

Since 2002 Neues Jahrbuch für Mineralogie is available online through Ingenta. It is part of the CrossRef service which allows direct access to referenced papers (published in this or other journals) which are available online. Conversely, papers in other journals are able to reference papers published in Neues Jahrbuch für Mineralogie by placing direct reference links.
