Guidelines for Authors

General Information

“Strahlentherapie und Onkologie” publishes original articles, reviews, short communications, case studies, literature reviews, and technical notes on radiation physics, radiation biology, oncology, especially radiologic oncology, and nuclear medicine.

Only ready-for-print manuscripts will be accepted that have not been published previously nor submitted for publication elsewhere. With acceptance of the manuscript the publisher automatically acquires both the national and international copyright covering the exclusive and unlimited right to reproduce and distribute the article in any form of reproduction. It is the responsibility of the author(s) to check whether the copyright of other parties is infringed upon. The former is (are) responsible for safeguarding the complete anonymity of all patients (also in figures).

Manuscripts can be submitted in English or German as hard copies in quadruplicate (two copies with authors' names and addresses and two without). They are to be sent together with a CD-ROM including the text, tables and figures to the editor in chief (letters to the editor and literature reviews can be submitted by e-mail):

The author(s) agree(s) to the work being submitted without mention of his/her (their) name(s) to independent, anonymous referees who review the professional content, and to its being edited prior to going to press. The corresponding author will receive proofs for correction.

Extent and Format of the Manuscript

1. Title page: a) Title of the article (as concise as possible; if necessary, with a subtitle); b) complete names of all authors, c) name(s) and address(es) of hospital(s) or institute(s) where the work was carried out, using numbers to denote the individual affiliation; d) short title of the article; e) consent of the head of the institute.

2. English and German abstracts (with translation of the title) should comprise in at most 250 words the main results and conclusions, especially as related to clinical work, structured in accordance with the article (Background and Purpose, Patients and Methods, Results, Conclusion). The respective translation of the summary (e.g. in the case of English articles, the German summary) should contain citations of the figures and tables. The summary is to be followed by 3 to 7 English and German key words each.

3. Main text: The article (including figures, tables and references) should be limited to 5–6 printed pages (2,700 words including English and German abstracts, but *without* tables, captions and

references). The manuscript should be written with a spacing of 1.5 lines on sequentially numbered pages with a wide margin. The article should be structured with section headings (possibly subheadings). Abbreviations should be avoided, even if the terms occur repeatedly in the text, trade names marked with ® or ™, respectively.

4. References: The list of references, numbered in alphabetical order, should include all those cited in the text (numbers in square brackets). References should be from citable publications, including the two latest volumes of “Strahlentherapie und Onkologie”.

Format of the references

a) Journals: names of author(s) followed by initials (without periods). Title of article. Journal title (abbreviated according to Index medicus/Medline), year of publication; volume number: first and last page number.

Example:

16. Hayes DL, Wang PJ, Reynolds DM. Interference with cardiac pacemakers by cellular telephones. N Engl J Med 1997;336:1473–86.

b) Books: names of author(s) followed by initials (without periods). Title of article. In: Editor. Title of book. Location of publisher; year of publication; page numbers.

Example:

17. Lison AE, Losse H. Interstitielle Nephritis. In: Riecker G, ed. Therapie innerer Krankheiten, 8th edn. Berlin–Heidelberg–New York: Springer, 1998:229–31.

5. Address for correspondence: Complete postal address of the corresponding author with academic degree, telephone and fax number, and e-mail address.

6. Tables and figures are to be numbered in the order in which they appear in the text and provided separately. Data explained in tables should not be repeated in the text. In tables use horizontal lines only. Tables should be short and precise.

Figures must be of high quality (300 dpi) and – in addition to the printouts – should be provided on CD-ROM as individual files in tiff, eps or jpeg format, otherwise as glossy photographic prints or slides, original X-ray images or paper prints (indicate top/bottom). Graphs should have legible lettering.

7. Captions for figures and tables, including explanation of signs and symbols, are to be provided in both English and German on a separate page.

Corrections

Corrections in the proofs are restricted to typographic and factual errors, as well as the insertion of information requested (■) by the journal. The authors will be invoiced for any excessive corrections. The proofs are to be returned to the publisher with permission to print by the date specified. Otherwise, permission of the author will be assumed.
