Authors wishing to include figures or text passages that have already been published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) and to include evidence that such permission has been granted when submitting their papers. Any material received without such evidence will be assumed to originate from the authors.

Submission information: Authors should submit their manuscripts electronically at the Executive Editor's journal website (<http://www.cs.uvm.edu/~kais/>) by clicking on the Submission Information link and following the submission instructions there.

Final manuscript submission: The Executive Editor will send detailed instructions for electronic submission of accepted papers.

- **Illustrations:** The preferred figure formats are EPS for vector graphics exported from a drawing program and TIFF for halftone illustrations. EPS files must always contain a preview in TIFF of the figure. The file name (one file for each figure) should include the figure number.

- **Scan resolution:** Scanned line drawings should be digitized with a minimum resolution of 800 dpi relative to the final figure size. For digital halftones, 300 dpi is usually sufficient.

- **Color illustrations:** Store color illustrations as RGB (8 bits per channel) in TIFF format.

- **Vector graphics:** Fonts used in the vector graphics must be included. Please do not draw with hairlines. The minimum line width is 0.2 mm (i.e. 0.567 pt) relative to the final size.

If electronic submissions are not possible, authors can submit hardcopy papers by sending five copies to any one of the three Editors or the Executive Editor, Xindong Wu, Department of Computer Science, University of Vermont, Burlington, VT 05405, USA. In addition, an e-mail message in ASCII text must be sent to xindong@computer.org, containing the title, author details, an abstract and keywords.

The manuscripts and the figures will not normally be returned, unless specifically requested by the authors.

Manuscripts which are returned to the authors for revision should be sent back within two months; otherwise they will be considered withdrawn. Rejected manuscripts will not be returned to the authors (except for original illustrations).

Papers that do not conform to the journal norms may be returned to the authors for revision before being considered for publication.

The author is responsible for the accuracy of the references.

Manuscript Preparation

All manuscripts are subject to copy editing.

- Title page
- A concise and informative title
- The name(s) of the author(s)
- The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
- The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the communicating author

Correspondence, proofs and offprints will be sent to the first named author unless otherwise stated.

- **Abstract.** Each paper must be preceded by an abstract presenting the most important results and conclusions in no more than 200 words.

- **Keywords.** Four to eight keywords should be supplied after the Abstract for indexing purposes.

- **Abbreviations** should be defined at first mention in the abstract and again in the main body of the text and used consistently thereafter.

- **Essential footnotes** to the text should be numbered consecutively and placed at the bottom of the page to which they refer.

- **Acknowledgements.** These should be as brief as possible. Any grant that requires acknowledgement should be mentioned. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

- **Funding.** Authors are expected to disclose any commercial or other associations that might pose a conflict of interest in connection with submitted material. All funding sources supporting the work and institutional or corporate affiliations of the authors should be acknowledged.

- **Appendix.** If there is more than one appendix, they should be numbered consecutively. Equations in appendices should be designated differently from those in the main body of the paper, e.g. (A1),

(A2) etc. In each appendix equations should be numbered separately.

References

The list of References should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications should only be mentioned in the text.

In the text, references should be cited by author and year (e.g. Hammer 1994; Hammer and Sjöqvist 1995; Hammer et al. 1993) and listed in alphabetical order in the reference list.

Examples: *For journals:* Cooley R, Mobasher B, Srivastava J (2002)

Title of article. Know and Inf Sys 1:5-32

For books: Langton CG (2003) Title of Book. Publisher, Place of Publication, pp 201-222

Chapter in a book (or paper in a proceedings): Yamamoto Y, Sasaki T, Tokoro M (2003) Title of chapter. In: Floreano D, Nicoud J-D, Mondada F (eds) Title of Book. Publisher, Place, pp 39-48

Note that the first three authors' names should be given in full: if there are more than three authors, et al. should be used after the third name.

References are the authors' responsibility and failure to supply complete references and/or inaccuracies may lead to a delay in publication.

References such as "personal communications" or "unpublished data" cannot be included in the reference list, but should be mentioned in the text in parentheses; this also applies to papers presented at meetings but not yet published or accepted for publication. A date should be given for both "personal communications" and "unpublished data".

Papers which have been accepted for publication should be included in the list of references with the name of the journal and "in press".

If available the Digital Object Identifier (DOI) of the cited literature should be added at the end of the reference in question.

Example: Acevedo R, Samaniego R, Moreno Diaz de la Espina S (2002) Coiled bodies in nuclei from plant cells evolving from dormancy to proliferation. *Chromosoma* 110:559-569 DOI 10.1007/s00412-001-0178-9

- **Illustrations and Tables.** All figures (photographs, graphs or diagrams) and tables should be cited in the text, and each numbered consecutively throughout. Figure parts should be identified by lower-case roman letters. Figure legends should be included in the text and not in the figure file.

Line drawings. Please submit good-quality prints. The inscriptions should be clearly legible.

Half-tone illustrations (black and white and color). Please submit well-contrasted photographic prints with the top indicated on the back.

For **color illustrations** the authors will be expected to make a contribution (€307.00 per page plus 17.5% VAT) towards the extra costs.

Tables should have a title and a legend explaining any abbreviation used in that table. Footnotes to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters.

Proofreading

LaTeX files are slightly modified during the TeX-editing process so that the general presentation rules of the journal are adhered to. Word files have to be converted and should be proofread carefully by the author.

Authors should make their proof corrections on a printout of the pdf file supplied, checking that the text is complete and that all figures and tables are included. After online publication, further changes can only be made in the form of an Erratum, which will be hyperlinked to the article. **The author is entitled to formal corrections only. Substantial changes in content, e.g. new results, corrected values, title and authorship are not allowed without the approval of the responsible editor. In such a case please contact the Editorial Office or the Executive Editor before returning the proofs to the publisher.**

OnlineFirst publication

After receipt of the author's proof corrections and the Copyright Transfer Statement, Springer-Verlag will publish the corrected papers OnlineFirst at <http://springeronline.com/journal/10115>. The date "Published online" and the digital object identifier (DOI) for citation purposes will be mentioned online and in the print edition published later.

Offprints

25 offprints of each contribution are supplied free of charge. If you wish to order additional offprints you must return the order form with the corrected proofs. You are then entitled to receive a pdf file of your article for your own personal use.
