

Instructions for authors

1. The author(s) transfer(s) the **copyright** to their article to Springer-Verlag effective if and when the article is accepted for publication. The copyright covers the exclusive and unlimited rights to reproduce and distribute the article in any form (printing, electronic media or any other); it also covers translation rights for all languages and countries. For U.S. authors the copyright is transferred to the extent transferable.

Manuscript must be written in English.

To speed up the refereeing process, **submissions** should preferably be in the form of a pdf file attached to an e-mail and addressed to the editor responsible for the field in question. If it is not possible to provide pdf files, three copies of the manuscript should be submitted. The copies should be typed, double-spaced with wide margins, and on one side of the paper only.

Manuscripts must be accompanied by the "Copyright Transfer Statement" (the form is regularly published in this journal).

Rejected manuscripts will be returned to the authors only if they contain important original comments from the referees. Original illustrations will always be returned.

In order to reduce mailing costs, manuscripts will not normally be returned.

All manuscripts are, in any case, subject to copy editing and will, if necessary, be returned to the authors to answer open questions or to supply missing information before being sent to the printers for composition.

When corrections are extensive, the author is responsible for having the manuscript retyped.

Authors submitting **diskettes** are requested to follow the technical instructions for manuscripts and illustrations in electronic form printed in each issue of the journal. Please to not transmit any such data to the publisher until your manuscript has been reviewed and accepted for publication.

2. The **title page** should include:

- name(s) of author(s)
- title of paper
- affiliation(s) of each author, with complete addresses
- any footnotes referring to the title
- address for correspondence
- a fax number and e-mail address

3. The material must be arranged as follows:

- Abstract
- Key words (up to 5)
- Introduction
- Materials and methods
- Results
- Discussion
- Acknowledgement(s)
- References
- Figure legends
- Tables

For details of presentation, a recent issue of the journal should be consulted.

4. **Footnotes** to the title of the paper appear without a symbol; those to the text are numbered consecutively; footnotes to tables should be indicated by superscript lowercase letters, except for those referring to statistical values, where asterisks are used.

5. **Genus and species names** should be in italics.

6. **Symbols** should be used consistently in figures, tables and text (lowercase or capital letters, arabic or roman numerals).

7. **Tables** must be numbered consecutively with arabic numerals and submitted separately from the text at the end of the paper. Each table should have a short title.

8. **References.** Only works that are cited in the text and that have been accepted for publication should be listed at the end of the paper in alphabetical order under the first author's name. Papers by two authors should be listed alphabetically according to the second author's name. Publications by three or more authors should be listed chronologically.

References should be cited in the text by numbers in square brackets referring to a numbered list.

9. **Illustrations** must be restricted to the minimum needed to clarify the text. Previously published illustrations are usually not accepted. Data given in graphs or tables should not be repeated in the text. All figures, whether photographs, graphs, or diagrams, must be mentioned in the text, and the top of the figure, the title of the paper, the author's name, and the figure number should be marked lightly on the reverse side in soft pencil. All figures are to be numbered consecutively throughout and submitted separately. The figures should match either the column width (8.6 cm) or the printing area (17.6 × 23.6 cm). Whenever possible, several figures should be grouped into a plate.

Illustrations prepared in digital form must be in accordance with the technical instructions for manuscripts and illustrations in electronic form that are published in this journal.

9.1 **Line drawings.** High quality prints or good originals should be submitted. The inscriptions should be clearly legible. Letters 2 mm high are recommended. Computer drawings are acceptable provided they are of comparable quality to line drawings. Computer-drawn lines and curves must be smooth.

9.2 **Halftone illustrations.** Sharp, well-contrasted photographic prints trimmed at right angles and in the desired final size should be submitted. If reduction is absolutely necessary, the scale desired should be indicated. The publishers reserves the right to reduce or enlarge illustrations.

9.3 For **color illustrations** the authors will be expected to make a contribution of € 485 per article towards the extra costs.

10. **Legends** must be short and appended to the text. They should provide a brief, self-sufficient description of each illustration.

11. **Electronic Supplementary Material.** Data such as black and white or colour illustrations, large tables, animations, video clips, or sound recordings, that are not essential for the understanding of a printed article but yet of interest can be put on Springer-Verlag's server and will be accessible free of charge on the contents site of this journal. Such material has to be submitted in electronic form (see the special instructions that are regularly published in this journal) and will also be reviewed. Reference to this material will be given with the printed article.

12. **Offprints.** One complimentary copy is supplied. Orders for offprints can be placed by returning the order form with the corrected proofs. When you order offprints, you are entitled to receive in addition a pdf file of your article for your own personal use.
