Cancer Immunology Immunotherapy is published as a Springer-Online-first publication. Online First articles are published within the Alert service (http://springer link.com) in a temporary directory. For the publication in the printed version, only the final page numbers, the citation line and the online publication date will be added.

To allow speedy publication manuscripts should be prepared carefully in accordance with the following points.

- 1. *Electronic submission:* Authors are encouraged to submit their manuscript online using the link given on the journal homepage http://cii.manuscript central.com
- 2. Manuscripts submitted by regular mail should be accompanied by the electronic version on disk (saved in one file including text and figures), preferably in Word of rtf format. E-mail and fax numbers should be given together with the address.
- 3. Manuscripts must be in the English language.
- 4. Only *new*, previously unpublished results given in concise form, will be accepted. Known facts should only be briefly mentioned, with appropriate literature citations.
- 5. Every manuscript should be preceded by an *abstract* and up to six *keywords*. The abstract should be suitable for direct publication in current awareness publications or information retrieval systems, and should include the main points of the paper.
- 6. Citations in the text should be by numbers in square brackets.
- 7. *References* should be numbered in alphabetical order.

- 8. Quantities and units must be designated using SI units whenever possible (e.g. Pa instead of bar). The metric system is to be used. Concentrations should be given exclusively as mass or amount-ofsubstance concentrations. The use of ppm, ppb, ppt, volume and weight percentages etc. is to be avoided.
- 9. Figures and tables. All figures (photographs, graphs or diagrams) and tables should be cited in the text, and each consecutively numbered throughout. Figure parts and footnotes to tables should be identified by lower-case roman letters. The same data should not be given in both tables and graphs. For color illustrations the authors will be expected to make a contribution (\in 485. US \$ 534, plus 16% VAT) towards the extra costs, irrespective of the number of color figures. Figure parts should be identified by lowercase roman letters.
- 10. For *line drawings* please submit good quality prints. The inscriptions should be clearly legible. Letters 2 mm high are recommended. Computer drawings are acceptable provided they are of comparable quality to line drawings. Computer-drawn curves and lines must be smooth. For **halftone reproduction** please submit well-contrasted photographic prints, trimmed at right angles and in the desired final size

Instructions to authors

(8.6 cm column with or up to 17.6 cm page width). Inscriptions should be about 2 mm high. The authors must guarantee that the reproduction of illustrations in which a patient is recognizable is either approved by the patient him/ herself of his/her legal representative.

- 11. Authors should make their proof corrections on a printout of the pdf file supplied, checking that the text is complete and that all figures and tables are included. After online publication, further changes can only be made in the form of an Erratum, which will be hyperlinked to the article. Corrected *proofs* should be returned to the production editor without delay.
- 12. After print publication authors receive two copies of the issue free of charge. Orders of *offprints* can be placed by returning the order form with the corrected proofs. When you order offprints, you are entitled to receive in addition a pdf file of your article for your own personal use.
- 13. The author(s) transfer(s) the copyright to an article to Springer-Verlag effective if and when the article is accepted for publication. The copyright covers the exclusive and unlimited rights to reproduce and distribute the article in any form of reproduction (printing, electronic media or any other form): it also covers translation rights for all languages and countries. For U.S. authors the copyright is transferred to the extent transferable.
