## Instructions for authors

### 1. General

The author(s) transfer(s) the copyright to his/her/their article to Springer-Verlag, effective if and when the article is accepted for publication. The copyright covers the exclusive and unlimited rights to reproduce and distribute the article in any form of reproduction (printing, electronic media or any other form); it also covers translation rights for all languages and countries. For U. S. authors the copyright is transferred to the extent transferable.

Manuscripts submitted may not be under consideration for publication elsewhere.

*Neurosurgical Review* publishes

- Comprehensive reviews (the reviews are the main focus of this journal)
- Comments to the reviews
- Original articles
- Congress reports
- Letters to the editors
- Book reviews
- Notes from the industry

Submitted reviews and original articles are subject to peer review. Authors are encouraged to provide names and addresses of four potential reviewers.

Manuscripts must be written in English. Spelling may be British or American, but it must be consistent throughout the paper. All manuscripts are subject to copy editing. The author will be contacted to answer any open questions or to supply missing information. Manuscripts must be accompanied by the "Copyright Transfer Statement" (the form is regularly published in this journal).

Manuscripts submitted for publication must contain a statement to the effect that all human studies have been approved by the appropriate ethics committee and have therefore been performed in accordance with the ethical standards laid down in the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki. It should also be stated clearly in the text that all persons gave their informed consent prior to their inclusion in the study. Details that might disclose the identity of the subjects under study should be omitted.

Reports of animal experiments must state that the "Principles of laboratory animal care" (NIH publication No. 86-23, revised 1985) were followed, as well as specific national laws (e.g. the current version of the German Law on the Protection of Animals) where applicable.

The editor reserves the right to reject manuscripts that do not comply with these requirements. The author will be held responsible for false statements or for failure to fulfill the above-mentioned requirements.

### 2. Manuscripts

Manuscripts must be written double-spaced and with wide margins.

A review article should not exceed **40 manuscript pages** including references, tables and figure legends. Depending on the size, 15–25 illustrations are acceptable. In addition, one typical color print for the journal cover (size: 8 × 8 cm) should be submitted.

Comments to the review articles are limited to five manuscript pages each.

**Original articles** should not exceed **15 manuscript pages** including references, tables and figure legends. Up to eight illustrations are acceptable.

Arrange the manuscript as follows: (1) title page, (2) abstract and keywords, (3) body of paper, (4) acknowledgements, (5) references, (6) figure legends, (7) tables (8) figures, (9) permissions.

**Title page:** Provide a complete title. List complete names of all authors and names and full location of department and institution where the work was performed. List grant support and other assistance. (Acknowledgements are listed at the end of the text.) If the paper was presented at a scientific meeting, indicate the name of the meeting, date, and location in a footnote. Provide the name, complete mailing address, telephone number, **fax number and/or e-mail address** of the corresponding author.

**Abstract:** Limit the abstract to 200 words. Do not use abbreviations, footnotes or references. List up to six keywords.

**Body of the paper:** Organize the text by using ample subheadings.

**Acknowledgements:** Limit this paragraph to those who have contributed to the paper.

### 3. References

Cite references in the order of appearance in the text using numbers in square brackets. Double check that the list of references corresponds to the citations in the text. While it is acceptable to cite personal communications and unpublished data in the text, they cannot be included in the list of references. Journal abbreviations must conform to those used in *Index Medicus*.

### 4. Tables, illustrations

Numerical data given in graphs or tables must not be duplicated. Tables (including titles and footnotes) should be submitted on separate pages.

All figures, whether photographs, graphs or diagrams, should be numbered consecutively throughout and submitted on separate sheets. Figures will generally be reduced to 8.6 cm (column width) or 13.1 cm (to accommodate a side caption). Related figures will be

arranged together whenever possible. The name of the author(s) should appear on a label and the top should be indicated.

Facial photographs must be accompanied by a statement signed by the patient or his/her legal guardian in which written permission is given to publish. If this is not possible, the author must ensure that the patient cannot be identified.

**Line drawings:** Good-quality prints or laser printed computer drawings should be submitted. The inscriptions should be clearly legible and in proportion to the overall size of the figure.

**Halftone illustrations:** Well-contrasted photographic prints trimmed at right angles should be submitted.

For **color illustrations** the authors will be expected to make a contribution (€ 485, US \$ 534, plus 16% VAT) towards the extra costs, irrespective of the number of color figures.

### 5. Additional

**Footnotes:** Type footnotes on the manuscript page on which they occur.

**Drug names:** In general, generic names should be used. If necessary, brand names can be inserted in parentheses at first mention in the text.

**Trademarks:** If trademarks of instruments and other devices are mentioned, list manufacturer and city.

### 6. Manuscripts in electronic form

Please submit the final, accepted version of your manuscript in electronic form (on diskette or via ftp). Springer offers a user-friendly **Word document template** for writing your manuscript. This is available on Springer's internet home page <http://www.springer.de>. Please consult the **Technical instructions for manuscripts and illustrations in electronic form** regularly published in this journal or consult our internet home page. However, please do not transmit any data until the manuscript has been reviewed and accepted for publication.

**Electronic graphic data** should be submitted in tif (low or no compression) or eps format and each figure saved in a separate file.

### 7. Offprints

Offprints may be ordered at cost price when page proofs are returned.

- Copyright Transfer Statement enclosed
