

# Information for Authors

## Scope

The IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON GAMES (TG) publishes original high-quality articles covering scientific, technical, and engineering aspects of games.

## Publication Timeline

Every effort is made to ensure minimum delay from submission to publication. Authors have a key role to play in minimizing the delay between initial submission and publication, largely by ensuring that manuscripts are of high quality both in terms of content and presentation. Use of a proofreading service is highly recommended for any authors who are not native English speakers.

When the final version of a manuscript is accepted, it is immediately published electronically on IEEE Xplore and given a Digital Object Identifier (DOI), at which time it enters the queue for publication in the paper version. In line with the IEEE's policy on scholarly publishing, authors are also free to archive the PDF of the published paper on their own website or institutional repository.

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TG publishes letters, short papers, and full papers. Letters typically comment on existing papers but may also present new research where the result may be concisely described and are limited to four pages in the journal's two-column format. Short papers report sufficiently interesting new theories and/or developments/results/simulations/experiments on previously unpublished work in the area, and are limited to six pages in the journal's two-column format. Full papers may be research articles, surveys, or tutorials. They are archival quality papers making a significant contribution to the field, and are limited to 10 pages. Any additional pages are subject to overlength page charges, with the total not exceeding 14 pages.

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## Style for Manuscript

TG follows the standard two-column format IEEE TRANSACTIONS. For guidelines and templates please follow this link: <http://www.ieee.org/web/publications/authors/transjnl/index.html>. A list of 2–5 keywords is required for all manuscripts. Authors are encouraged to put detailed derivations in appendixes. Authors must suggest a publication category for their paper, but this may be changed by the Editor-in-Chief.

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
