

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

The Turkish Journal of Chemistry accepts original articles and letters to the Editor in various fields of research in chemistry and chemical engineering. Submissions from contributors of all nationalities are welcome. The Editor may invite reviews covering recent developments in particular fields of interest.

Manuscripts must be typewritten in English on white A4 standard paper (210x297mm), double-spaced throughout, on one side of the page only in a legible font. Submissions must be made in triplicate (one original and two complete copies). Symbols and equations that cannot be typewritten should be written neatly by hand in India ink. Italics and other special characters should be indicated clearly. Nomenclature, abbreviations and choice of symbols should be in accordance with the rules of the IUPAC. Manuscripts should be easily understandable with clear explanations. Unnecessary explanations and details of routine procedures should be avoided.

All manuscripts must be accompanied by the Copyright Release Form, which can be found following the Instructions. This form must be completed and signed by all the authors before processing of the manuscript can begin.

After the manuscript has been accepted for publication, i.e., after referee-recommended revisions are complete, the authors will not be permitted to make any additions.

Note: before publication, the galley proofs are always sent to the authors for correction. Mistakes or omissions that occur due to some negligence on our part during the final printing will be rectified in an errata section of a later issue. However, this does not include those errors left uncorrected by the authors in the galley proofs.

The format of the manuscript should be as follows:

1. TITLE: Should be short and informative.

2. AUTHOR(S): The complete, unabbreviated names should be given along with full addresses.

3. ABSTRACT: Should not exceed 200 words.

4. INTRODUCTION: Should include the aims of the study and results from previous notable studies.

5. EXPERIMENTAL: Experimental methods should be described clearly and briefly.

6. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION: This section may be separated into two parts.

Unnecessary repetition should be avoided.

7. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS: Should be as short as possible.

8. REFERENCES: Must be numbered in the paper, indicated by superscript, and listed in the order in which they appear in the text.

References must appear as follows:

Periodicals: (i) Initial(s) and Surname(s) of author(s), (ii) Title of the periodical abbreviated according to the international abstract list of journals, (iii) Volume number, (iv) Page numbers (first and last pages), (v) Year of publication in parentheses.

Example: O. Çakmak and M. Balcı, **Tetrahedron Lett.** **31**, 2349-52 (1990).

Book, section of a book, encyclopedia, or thesis: (i) Initial(s) and Surname(s) of author(s), (ii) Title of publication, (iii) Name of the editors (if applicable), (iv) First and last page numbers, (v) Name of publisher and place of publication, (vi) Year of publication.

9. FOOTNOTES: Footnotes should be avoided if possible, but when necessary, should be short and not contain any important part of the work and should be numbered in superscript.

10. FIGURES AND TABLES: All illustrations (photographs, drawings, graphs, etc.), not including tables, must be labelled "Figure".

The correct position of each table and figure must be clearly indicated in the paper.

All tables and figures must have a caption and/or legend and be numbered (e.g., Table 1, Figure 1), unless there is only one table or figure, in which case it should be labelled "Table" or "Figure".

All tables and figures must be numbered consecutively.

All captions and legends must also appear on a separate sheet, double-spaced and labelled according to the relevant table or figure.

Tables and figures, including caption, title, column heads, and footnotes, must not exceed 16x20cm and should be no smaller than 8cm in width. Tables must be clearly typed, each on a separate sheet, and double-spaced.

Tables may be continued on another sheet if necessary, but the dimensions still apply.

Figures must be the originals drawn clearly in India ink on white paper or printed on smooth tracing/drawing paper. Reduced photocopies are not acceptable. Photographs must be clear, black and white, and printed on glossy paper.

11. APPENDICES: All appendices must be typed on separate sheets and should be numbered with capital roman numerals.

12. COMPUTER DISKS: If you are able to initially prepare your manuscript in a LaTeX file including the figures translated into the picture environment of LaTeX or Encapsulated PostScript format (EPS), we advise you to do so. Then, if your manuscript is accepted for publication, we will ask you to submit a revised disk copy of your manuscript, which will enable us to more efficiently and accurately prepare proofs. (This is not a requirement but is strongly encouraged.)

FINAL CHECKLIST

Before submitting your paper (and other writings as applicable) please make sure that the following requirements have all been met:

- Copyright Release form is enclosed, completed and signed by all authors
- Three copies of the paper are submitted (including one original)
- Entire paper is double-spaced (NOT 1.5) including abstract, tables, captions/legends, references
- Margins are 3cm each side
- Font size is 12pt or 3mm
- Font is legible
- There are no word breaks at the ends of lines
- Decimals are shown by a decimal point (e.g., 10.24) and not by a comma (e.g., NOT 10,24)
- The percent sign appears after the number (e.g., 53%) and not before (e.g., NOT %53)
- Names of authors are written in full (not abbreviated)
- English title is given
- English address is given
- Original figures are enclosed
- Figures are prepared correctly, according to the instructions
- Figures are min. 8x20cm; max. 16x20cm
- Figures are referred to consecutively in the paper
- Tables are min. 8x20cm; max. 16x20cm
- Tables are referred to consecutively in the paper
- Table and figure legends/captions are typed on a separate sheet
- Appendices (if any) are typed on a separate sheet
- References are typed according to the instructions
- References are referred to consecutively in the paper, indicated by superscript
- References are listed in the order of appearance
