

## Guidelines for Authors

The journal is published simultaneously in Russian (under the title *Biologiya Morya* in the Russian Federation) and in English (under the title *Russian Journal of Marine Biology* in the United States) by MAIK "Nauka/Interperiodica" (Russia). The English edition is distributed worldwide by Kluwer/Academic Publishers.

The journal publishes review and original research papers on various aspects of theoretical and applied marine biology as well as chronicles, book reviews, notes on the history of marine biology, and the activities of marine biological institutions and scientists. All papers are published in Russian.

The journal welcomes contributions from foreign and Russian authors, written in Russian or English, and not exceeding 30 typewritten pages for reviews, 15 pages for full-size papers, and nine pages for short communications. The number of pages includes references, tables, figures, and figure captions. The text should be 1.5-spaced, with the left margin not less than 2.5 cm. The number of characters in the line should not exceed 60. One original and two copies should be provided both of the manuscript and illustrations. A series of papers presented as subdivisions of the same title (I, II, etc.) are accepted only by request of the editorial board.

Please include an identical electronic copy of your manuscript (without figures) prepared on a IBM/PC-compatible computer along with a hard copy printout. Do not hyphenate or use specific fonts to italicize or boldface; insert a single space between words and after punctuation; do not use underlining. Floppy discs 3.5" and MS Word of the latest versions or .rtf-files are acceptable. Label the disk with the name of the word-processing package used, your name, and the name of the file on the disk.

Manuscripts should be arranged as follows.

Title of paper, author's initials and last name, address(es) of scientific institutions with a zip code and e-mail address. Use numerals to indicate the institute with which the author is affiliated. 2. Summary (1/2 page) with keywords (at the end, as a separate line, no more

than six key words). 3. Text. 4. Acknowledgments. 5. Literature cited. 6. Tables. 7. Figure captions. 8. A separate list of paper with the title, author's name, and address(es) of institution(s). 9. When the manuscript is submitted in Russian, please add a list of specific terms translated into English. The manuscript should be signed by the author (coauthors). Please indicate a contact person, e-mail address, fax and telephone numbers. All drawings, maps, diagrams, and photographs must be numbered consecutively and referred to as "Fig." Line drawings and maps should be in Indian ink on white paper or should be made on a laser printer. For half-tone reproduction, only high-quality glossy black-and-white photos or photoprinter works are acceptable. On the back of each figure, written in pencil, should be the author(s) name(s) and the number of the figure; the top of the figure should be indicated if its correct orientation in the text is not evident. Scales, numerals, and lettering should be inserted on the second and third copies of the figures; magnification should be indicated in figure captions. The amount of full-size figures should be minimal. No more than two figures can be enclosed in a short communication.

Each table should be typewritten on a separate page of the manuscript. Tables must not be included in the text.

Literature citations in text should be given by author's last name followed by a comma and the date in brackets. More than two authors are to be cited by the first author's name plus *et al.* In the references, arrange names of authors chronologically. References are listed alphabetically. Titles of journals are abbreviated. The sequence of citation is as follows.

*Books*: author's last name, initials, full title, place of publication, publisher, year of publication, number of pages. Example: Zernov S.A., *General Hydrobiology*, Moscow; Leningrad: Biomedgiz., 1934. 503 pp. *Journals*: author's last name, initials, full title of paper, two slashes, title of journal, year of publication, volume, issue, and first and last page nos. Example: Bondy S.C. and McKee M., Prevention of Chemically Induced Synaptosomal Changes, *J. Neurosci. Res.*, 1990, vol. 25, no. 2, pp. 229–235. *Collection of papers*: Scott A.B., Enhanced growth of trout in *Reservoir Fisheries*, Murphy E.F. and Smith G.H., Eds., Edinburgh: Robertson, 1992, pp. 13–21.

The author will receive 10 offprints of the Russian edition free of charge.
