NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS (effective March 1, 2001)

Manuscripts are accepted for consideration with the understanding that they have not been published elsewhere except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture, review or thesis and are not concurrently under review elsewhere. Reference should be made to previously published abstracts, etc. in the Introduction. The submission of manuscript implies also that its publication has been approved by all the authors. Copyright of published articles will be left to the authors.

Manuscripts:

- (one of high quality, suitable for direct reproduction) and two (2) copies, carefully inserted in a folder and protected from creasing during mailing,
- and in MS Word for Windows, extension ***.doc** or, preferable ***.rtf**) on a disc (IBM compatible, MS-DOS system) (or as a text (ASCII) file, usually with the extension ***.txt**) should be sent to the editorial office:

The contributions will be published in uniform form therefore submitting an electronic version will speed up processing.

For the contributions that will be printed by direct reproduction the typing and format instructions must be strictly adhered to. Contributors with access to word processors and/or laser printers should try to adhere to the style exhibited at the end of these Notes as closely as possible.

apers must be word-processed on good quality paper. Papers prepared with the use of a conventional typewriter not accompanied by a disc will be returned to authors. The finished paper must be ready for direct litho reproduction and hence must be as clean and neat as possible; messy erasures and alterations will show up in the printing. Non-compliance will result in the return of the manuscript to the authors and delay its publication. Please use the A4 paper size (21 x 29.7 cm), if not possible keep the left and top margins. The typing area is 15.6 cm wide by 24.5 cm deep, excluding running headlines, which means: a 2.7 cm left margin, 2.7 cm right margin, 2.6 cm top margin and 2.6 cm bottom margin.

For Short Communications the number of pages should not exceed 5.

On the first page, leave an additional 5 cm space from the top, then type the paper title all in capitals. The title should be centered and bold. Leave 1 cm space, then type the author's name(s) in upper case letters. Author's first (given) names in full should precede their names. The author's affiliation should follow on the next line also in upper and lower case letters.

Type the text with **1 line** spacing to the full 15.6 cm width (**Times New Roman font 14 points high is recommended**).

Begin the text with Abstract placed 2 cm below the author's affiliation. Up to 8 Key Words should follow the Abstract. **Please right and left justify the text body without paragraph indents.**

Main text headings should be typed in bold **CAPITAL LETTERS**, over to the left. Leave extra space above and below headings. Second-level headings should be typed in **bold upper and lower case** letters, over to the left. Third level headings should be in upper and lower case letters, *italics* and over to the left.

All equations and formulae should be typed in the appropriate place in the text. Where symbols cannot be typed, they should be written very neatly in black ink.

Type tables as close as possible to the place of reference in the text. Put Tab.1 etc. at the top of the table in upper and lower case letters. Add only three horizontal lines; one at the top and the bottom of the table and one after the column headings. The table heading font size should be **12 points** high.

Photographs should be reduced to a suitable size, then pasted into the text. Please submit original photographs, not scans. Line-drawings can be pasted via a word processor. Color photographs can be printed only at the author's expense. The actual prices will be available from the Editors. The figure captions should be typed underneath the figures, as Fig.1 etc., with the caption run on after 3 typewriter spaces in upper and lower case letters using Times New Roman font, **12 points** high. Leave about 1 cm space above the figure and a similar space below the caption.

All tables, figures and photographs should be inserted into the text body in the final printout, as well as in the electronic version. When submitting the disc version please also save the figures separately as **wmf**, **tiff**, **jpg** or **gif** files. Scans should be of at least 600 dpi resolution.

References should be indicated in the text by arabic numerals in square brackets (e.g. [23]), numbered consecutively in order of appearance. The in-text references should not state the full names of referenced papers. The list of references should be typed at the end of the paper in numerical order. Journal titles should be in bold. Journal volumes should be underlined. Full titles of the references should be given. Book titles should be given in full, and bold. The first and last pages of references cited should be given.

Reference numbers should have hanging indent. Examples:

Footnotes should be typed on the appropriate page of the text and preceded by a short horizontal line (5 cm long). Add one line of space before a footnote. A list of the abbreviations used should be given as a footnote at the beginning of the text – at the first abbreviation. The corresponding author should be indicated in a footnote. Do not type page numbers on the manuscript. Number the pages lightly in blue pencil.
