## **Instructions for authors**

### 1 Legal requirements

The author(s) guarantee(s) that the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any language without the consent of the copyright owners, that the rights of third parties will not be violated, and that the publisher will not be held legally responsible should there be any claims for compensation.

Authors wishing to include figures or text passages that have already been published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) and to include evidence that such permission has been granted when submitting their papers. Any material received without such evidence will be assumed to originate from the authors.

Authors must indicate whether or not they have a financial relationship with the organization that sponsored the research. They should also state that they have had full control of all primary data and that they agree to allow *European Radiology* to review their data if requested. Therefore manuscripts must be accompanied by the "Conflict of Interest Disclosure Form." The form can be obtained from springeronline.com or from http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/eurradiol (Instructions and Forms).

Manuscripts reporting the results of experimental studies on human subjects must include a statement to the effect that informed consent was obtained after the nature of the procedure(s) had been fully explained.

The maintenance and care of experimental animals, to provide human treatment and to assure reliable results, are described in the National Institutes of Health guidelines for use of laboratory animals. Authors are advised to comply with these guidelines and to acknowledge such compliance in their manuscripts.

## 2 Open Choice Publication

In addition to the normal publication process (whereby an article is submitted to the journal and access to that article is granted to customers who have purchased a subscription), Springer now provides an alternative publishing option: Springer Open Choice. A Springer Open Choice article receives all the benefits of a regular 'subscription-based' article, but in addition is made available publicly through Springer's online platform SpringerLink. To publish via Springer Open Choice, upon acceptance please visit www.springeronline.com/openchoice to complete the relevant order form and provide the required payment information. Payment must be received in full before publication or articles will be published as regular subscription-model articles. We regret that Springer Open Choice cannot be ordered for published articles.

### 3 Editorial procedure

Authors should submit their manuscripts to European Radiology Editor's Office online to facilitate even quicker and more efficient processing. Electronic submission substantially reduces the editorial processing and reviewing times and shortens overall publication times. Please log directly onto the site

## 4 Manuscript preparation

■ Title page

- A concise and informative title
- The name(s) of the author(s)
- The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
- The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the communicating author

• Abstract. Each paper must be preceded by an abstract presenting the most important results and conclusions in no more than 200 words.

■ Keywords. Below the abstract please list three to five keywords as derived from the terms used in the RSNA Index to Imaging Literature (http://rsnaindex.rsnajnls.org) for indexing purposes.

• Abbreviations should be defined at first mention in the abstract and again in the main body of the text and used consistently thereafter.

Radiation measurements and laboratory values should be given using the Interna-

tional System of Units (SI) (source: SI Units in Radiation Protection and Measurements, NCRP Report no. 82 [August 1985]: "Now Read this: The SI Units Are Here." JAMA 1986; 255:2329-2339). Blood pressure should be given in millimeters of mercury. Abbreviations should be spelled out at first mention in the Abstract and again in the main body of the text, e.g. cerebrospinal fluid (CSF). Laboratory slang, clinical jargon, and uncommon abbreviations should be avoided.

• The **Introduction** should state the purpose of the investigation and give a short review of the pertinent literature.

■ The Materials and methods section should follow the Introduction and should provide enough information to permit repetition of the experimental work.

■ The **Results** section should describe the outcome of the study. Data should be presented as concisely as possible, if appropriate in the form of tables or figures, although very large tables should be avoided.

• The **Discussion** should be an interpretation of the results and their significance with reference to work by other authors.

■ Acknowledgements. These should be as brief as possible. Any grant that requires acknowledgement should be mentioned. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

■ The accuracy of References is the responsibility of the authors. Citations in the text should be by arabic numerals in square brackets, e.g. [2, 5, 12]. The list of References should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications should only be mentioned in the text.

References should be numbered in the order in which they appear in the text and listed in numerical order. Journal titles should be abbreviated according to *Index Medicus*. If available the **Digital Object Identifier** (**DOI**) of the cited literature should be added at the end of the reference in question. Examples:

■ Illustrations and Tables. All figures (photographs, graphs or diagrams) and tables should be cited in the text, and each numbered consecutively throughout. Figure parts should be identified by lower-case roman letters.

**Figure legends** must be brief, self-sufficient explanations of the illustrations. The legends should be placed at the end of the text.

Tables should have a title and a legend explaining any abbreviation used in that table. Footnotes to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters (or asterisks for significance values and other statistical data).

For **color illustrations** the authors will be expected to make a contribution (€ 485, US \$ 534, plus 16% VAT) towards the extra costs, irrespective of the number of color figures.

#### Case Reports

Because of continued pressure on space for original articles it is necessary to be even more circumspect about publishing case reports. Some may be suitable for consideration for "Tips and Tricks"; some may be remodeled for "Interpretation Corner"; some may be deemed more appropriate for EuroRad. However, it is unlikely that more than one or two case reports will be accepted each month in the future.

#### 5 Proofreading

Authors should make their proof corrections on a printout of the pdf file supplied, checking that the text is complete and that all figures and tables are included. After online publication, further changes can only be made in the form of an Erratum, which will be hyperlinked to the article. The author is entitled to formal corrections only. Substantial changes in content, e.g. new results, corrected values, title and authorship are not allowed without the approval of the responsible editor. In such a case please contact the Editorial Office or the Editorin-Chief before returning the proofs to the publisher.

#### 6 Offprints

One complimentary copy is supplied. Orders for offprints can be placed by returning the order form with the corrected proofs. When you order offprints, you are entitled to receive in addition a pdf file of your article for your own personal use.
