1. Submissions of manuscripts

Three copies of manuscripts intended for publication - in English, French or German - should be sent to the Institute under the address

Manuscripts prepared using TeX are preferred. Use of AMS-TeX version 2.0 or later, with the amsppt style file will speed up the production process considerably.

Upon receiving notice of acceptance of a manuscript, the author should submit his manuscript electronically:

2. Electronic submission of manuscripts

The rest of these instructions is only valid for accepted manuscripts.

Electronic versions of a manuscript should not be submitted before the paper is accepted.

The list of references

Before making the electronic submission of a paper accepted by Acta Mathematica, authors should make sure the reference list is complete. Mathematical Reviews and Zentralblatt für Mathematik contain the necessary information.

References should have the following format:

References to journal papers:

Name of the author(s) with initials, title of the paper, name of the journal as abbreviated by Mathematical Reviews, volume number, year and page numbers.

References to books:

Name of the author(s) with initials, title of the book, publishing house with the place of copyright, year. Possibly add the name of a series including volume number.

References to papers in a collective publication, such as the proceedings of a conference:

Name of the author(s) with initials, title of the paper, title of the collection, page numbers, publishing house with the place of copyright, year. If they are proceedings of a conference also

add the place and year of the conference. Possibly add the name of a series including volume number.

For a paper/book not written in a language using the Latin alphabet, e.g. Russian, Chinese or Japanese, the title should be translated into English, with the original language stated within brackets. If an English translation exists both a reference to it and to the original should be made.

Other types of references (e.g. preprints, or papers accepted but not yet printed) should follow these guidelines as closely as possible.

Please consult one of the latest issues of Acta Mathematica for examples of references.

Changes in the manuscript

If changes in the manuscript have been made - other than the correction of typing errors - approval has to be obtained from the editor in charge.

Instructions for electronic submission

Manuscripts prepared using a computer should be submitted in one of the following three ways.

- (a) Using the file transfer program ftp. (The preferred way.)
- (b) Via email.
- (c) On a 3.5" diskette. (Discouraged.)

The name of the file should be the surname of the (first) author with the usual extension, i.e. .tex if some type of TeX was used. If the surname has more than eight letters use the first eight ones.

Papers written in TeX should be submitted as standard ASCII text files. If some form of 8-bit encoding is used, all non-ASCII characters have to be translated into their corresponding TeX code, using only 7-bit encoding. For example, write é as {\'e}. If any non-standard files have been used, these have to be transmitted also, but it is preferred if the corresponding commands are merged into the main file whenever possible.

Papers not written using some form of TeX should be submitted as standard ASCII text files, or if that is not possible in a form as close to a standard ASCII text file as possible.

Pictures should be submitted in the same way. They should preferably be submitted as encapsulated postscript (.eps) files.

You should put a comment in the beginning of the (main) file saying what file it is, e.g.

(a) Using ftp The program ftp is used to transfer files between computers. The following instructions assume that the ftp program is available on your local system. There are minor variations in the default settings. If the instructions below do not work, you should consult your local system administrator. Here are the instructions: (i) Logging on First, type ftp ftp.ml.kva.se <return> When you see a message indicating that a connection has been opened, you need to log in using the username "anonymous". At the prompt type anonymous <return> You will be asked to enter a password; enter your complete email address here and press <return>. (ii) Depositing the file(s) Now change to the directory for depositing your file(s) with the command cd actamath/incoming <return> and deposit the file(s) with the command put <filename> <return> (iii) Logging out Type bye <return> When you have deposited your file(s), send an email message to Mikael Rågstedt at the address ragstedt@ml.kva.se with the name of the file(s) deposited. (b) Via email If you can you should use ftp instead of submitting the paper via email. If you submit a file via

email, send it to Mikael Rågstedt at the address

(c) On a 3.5" diskette

This should only be used if you cannot use ftp or email.
