The Asia-Pacific Journal of Operational Research (APJOR) provides a forum for practitioners, academics and researchers in Operational Research and related fields, within and beyond the Asia-Pacific region.

APJOR will place submissions in one of the following categories: General, Theoretical, OR Practice, Reviewer Survey, OR Education, and Communications (including short articles and letters). Theoretical papers should carry significant methodological developments. Emphasis is on originality, quality and importance, with particular emphasis given to the practical significance of the results. Practical papers, illustrating the application of Operational Research, are of special interest. Papers should include the steps followed, the extent to which the results have been used, and their critical success factors (both positive and negative). Applications which are of interest to the Asia-Pacific area are particularly welcome.

APJOR is published biannually. Language used will be English. Material that has already been published or submitted for publication elsewhere will not be accepted. All papers will be refereed. Decisions on papers will be made by the Editors with the advice of the referees. No inquiries concerning the screening process will be entertained. Manuscripts will normally not be returned to the authors.

Instructions to Authors

The following instructions should be observed in preparing manuscripts:

1. Manuscripts should be in English. The desired order of contents is Title, Author(s) and Affiliations, Abstract and Keywords, Main Text, Acknowledgments, References and Appendices. Tables and illustrations, complete with titles, labels and art work, should be placed in the text at the appropriate locations.
2. Manuscripts should be typed on one side of good quality white bond paper using double spacing, with 1-inch margins at the sides, top and bottom. Typists should refer to an issue of APJOR for style.
3. The title should be descriptive and concise. In addition, an abbreviated title (no more than 50 characters) to be used as a running head should be supplied.
4. The abstract should be brief, self-contained, explicit and should not exceed 200 words.
5. The statements of theorems, lemmas and propositions should be in italics, while labels like Definition, Theorem 1, Proof, etc., should be in boldface.
6. Equations should be numbered sequentially in parentheses by the right margin. Equations and formulas should include the appropriate punctuation.
7. Table captions should be placed immediately above the table, while figure captions should be placed immediately below the figure.
8. References cited in the text should be listed at the end of the manuscript. Beginning in Volume 9, Number 2, 1992, a new style for references is adopted. References should be listed in alphabetical order of the first author's surname. They should not be numbered. The following examples should be followed:

Hadley, G.(1970), *Nonlinear and Dynamic Programming*, Addison-Wesley Publishing Company, Reading, Massachusetts.

Powell, M.J.D.(1970), A new algorithm for unconstrained optimization, in J.Rosen, O. Mangasarian, and K Ritter, eds.: *Nonlinear Programming*, Academic Press, New York.

Tapley, B.P. and J.M. Lewallen (1967), Comparison of several numerical optimization methods, *Journal of Optimization Theory and Applications* 1, 1-32.

References should appear in the text as "...Tapley and Lewallen (1967) ..." or as "... (Tapley and Lewallen 1967, p.28) ...".

Full journal titles should be used, without any abbreviation. For example, use Operations Research rather than Oper. Res., and SIAM Journal of Applied Mathematics rather than SIAM J. Appl. Math.

9. Authors should submit a short statement (not more than 150 words) on important aspects of their professional career such as degrees obtained, positions held, research interests, and journals in which they have previously published.
10. Manuscripts should be sent in triplicate to the Editor- see inside front cover for details.
