The author(s) guarantee(s) that the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any language without the consent of the copyright holders, that the rights of third parties will not be violated, and that the publisher will not be held legally responsible should there be any claims for compensation.

Authors wishing to include figures or text passages that have already been published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright holder(s) and to include evidence that such permission has been granted when submitting their papers. Any material received without such evidence will be assumed to originate from the authors.

Manuscripts must be accompanied by the "Copyright Transfer Statement". The form can be obtained from springeronline.com/journal/00159. Please see page A2 for details relating to copyright.

Manuscripts should be submitted in English, in triplicate together with one set of illustrations to one of the following:

Please be sure to include your e-mail address and your fax number. Please do not transmit electronic data to the publisher until your manuscript has been reviewed and accepted for publication. Please follow the instructions below.

The manuscripts and the figures will not normally be returned, unless specifically requested by the authors.

The author is responsible for the accuracy of the references.

Manuscripts should be written in \LaTeX for which Springer-Verlag offers the macropackage $\LaTeX 2\epsilon$ document class `svjour`.

Formulae and symbols

These must be written legibly and will be typeset in italics. They should be written or marked as such in the manuscript unless they require different styling. Please use correct designations for standardized DIN regulations.

Title page

- The name(s) of the author(s)
- A concise and informative title
- The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
- The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the communicating author

Abstract

Each paper must be preceded by an abstract presenting the most important results and conclusions.

Key words

Up to six key words taken from the Thesaurus (Astron. Astrophys. Vol 352/3, 1999) should be supplied after the Abstract for indexing purposes.

Abbreviations

Abbreviations should be defined at first mention in the abstract and again in the main body of the text and used consistently thereafter.

Footnotes

Essential footnotes to the text should be numbered consecutively and placed at the bottom of the page to which they refer.

Acknowledgements

These should be as brief as possible. Any grant that requires acknowledgement should be mentioned. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

Appendices

If there is more than one appendix, they should be numbered consecutively. Equations in appendices should be designated differently from those in the main body of the paper, e.g. (A1), (A2) etc. In each appendix equations should be numbered separately.

References

The list of References should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications should only be mentioned in the text.

Citations in the text should be identified by numbers in square brackets, and the list of references at the end of the paper should be both alphabetized under the first author's name and numbered. References by the same author or team of authors should be listed in chronological order. Here are a few examples for the style of references:

Journal Article:

G.J. White, T.S. Monteiro, K.J. Richardson, M.J. Griffin, R. Rainey: *Astron. Astrophys.* 162, 253 (1986)

Complete book:

K. Rohlfs: *Tools of Radioastronomy*, Springer, Berlin Heidelberg New York (1986)

Single contribution in a book:

M. Stix: *On the Origin of Stellar Magnetism*, in *Lecture Notes in Physics*, Vol. 292: Solar and Stellar Physics, Proc. Titisee, eds. E.-H. Schröter, M. Schüssler, Springer, Berlin Heidelberg New York, pp. 15–38 (1987)

References such as "personal communications" or "unpublished data" cannot be included in the reference list, but should be mentioned in the text in parentheses: this also applies to papers presented at meetings but not yet published or accepted for publication. A date should be given for both "personal communications" and "unpublished data". Papers which have been accepted for publication should be included in the list of references with the name of the journal and "in press".

Oral communications should only be mentioned in the acknowledgements.

If available the Digital Object Identifier (DOI) of the cited literature should be added at the end of the reference in question. Example: Dyall KG (1998) Relative and non-relative finite nucleus optimized double zeta basis sets for the elements. *Theor Chem Acc* 99: 366-371 DOI 10.1007/s002149800025

Illustrations and Tables

All figures (photographs, graphs or diagrams) and tables should be cited in the text, and each numbered consecutively throughout. The placement of figures and tables should be indicated in the left margin. For submission of figures in electronic form see below.

Line drawings. Please submit good-quality prints. The inscriptions should be clearly legible.

Half-tone illustrations (black and white and color). Please submit well-contrasted photographic prints with the top indicated on the back. *Magnification* should be indicated by *scale bars*.

Plates. Several figures or figure parts should be grouped in a plate on one page.

Size of figures. The figures should either match the width of the column (12,2 cm) or be 10,0 cm wide. The maximum length is 19,0 cm.

Figure legends must be brief, self-sufficient explanations of the illustrations. The legends should be placed at the end of the text.

Tables should have a title and a legend explaining any abbreviation used in that table. Footnotes to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters (or asterisks for significance values and other statistical data).

If both the editors and the publisher agree *color illustrations* will be accepted.

Electronic submission of final version

Please send only the final version of the article, as accepted by the editors.

Text

The preferred format is L^AT_EX. The electronic version should include the original source (including all style files and figures) and a PostScript version of the compiled submission. Authors who prepare their papers with L^AT_EX are encouraged to use Springer-Verlag's

global macro package *svjour* for this journal, available at springeronline.com/journal/00159.

Illustrations

The preferred figure formats are EPS for vector graphics exported from a drawing program and TIF for halftone illustrations. EPS files must always contain a preview in TIF of the figure. The file name (one file for each figure) should include the figure number. Figure legends should be included in the text and not in the figure file.

- *Scan resolution:* Scanned line drawings should be digitized with a minimum resolution of 800 dpi relative to the final figure size. For digital halftones, 300 dpi is usually sufficient.
- *Color illustrations:* Store color illustrations as RGB (8 bits per channel) in TIF format.
- *Vector graphics:* Fonts used in the vector graphics must be included. Please do not draw with hairlines. The minimum line width is 0.2 mm (i.e., 0.567 pt) relative to the final size.

General information on data delivery

Please send us a zip file (text and illustrations in separate files) either:

- Via ftp.springer.de (to our ftp.server; log-in "anonymous"; password: your e-mail address; further information in the readme file on the server)
- By e-mail (only suitable for small volumes of data)
- or on any of the following media:
 - On a diskette [you may use .tar, .zip, .gzip (.gz), .sit, and compress (.Z)]
 - On a ZIP cartridge
 - On a CD-ROM

Please always supply the following information with your data: journal title, operating system, word processing program, drawing program, image processing program, compression program.

The file name should be memorable (e.g., author name), have no more than 8 characters, and include no accents or special symbols. Use only the extensions that the program assigns automatically.

Proofreading

L^AT_EX files are slightly modified during the T_EX-editing process so that the general presentation rules of the journal are adhered to. Word files have to be converted and should be proofread carefully by the author. Corrections should be clear; standard correction marks should be used. Corrections that lead to a change in the page layout should be avoided. The author is entitled to formal corrections only. Substantial changes in content, e.g. new results, corrected values, title and authorship are not allowed without the approval of the responsible editor. In such a case please contact the Editor, to whom the manuscript was submitted, before returning the proofs to the publisher.

After online publication, further changes can only be made in the form of an Erratum, which will be hyperlinked to the article.

Offprints, free copies

Two complimentary copies of the AAR issue, in which your article is published, will be supplied. Orders for offprints can be placed by returning the order form with the corrected proofs. When you order offprints, you are entitled to receive in addition a pdf file of your article for your own personal use.
