



GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Publication Ethics

The Journal European Poultry Science is committed to the highest standards of publication ethics and is taking every effort to prevent misconduct in publishing. Plagiarism will immediately result in an exclusion of the relevant author(s) from publishing in the Journal European Poultry Science.

The journal publishes original scientific papers and reviews in all fields of poultry science in German and English. Whole manuscripts or parts must not have been published before. All papers submitted to EPS are peer-reviewed according to international standards. Reviews are prepared anonymously by two independent referees without knowing names of authors. The Editor-in chief thoroughly pays attention that no conflict of interest exists between reviewers and authors. Any derogation from this rule must be notified to the Editor-in chief, immediately. He/she will initiate any necessary counteractive measures.

Subjects and languages of publication

1. The Journal European Poultry Science (Archiv für Geflügelkunde) publishes scientific original papers, critical reviews and reports in the whole field of poultry science.
2. Papers can be published in German or English with summaries in the other language.
3. Accepted manuscripts are only published as electronic versions on the website of the Journal (www.european-poultry-science.com).

Manuscripts

The articles should not be published elsewhere before and have to be written in appropriate language style. Submission of manuscripts written in poor English or German and manuscripts which are not strictly prepared according to the guidelines of the Journal will be rejected. Authors not familiar with the English language are requested to ask for assistance before submission of the manuscript. The evaluation of the manuscripts is done by a referee system. Manuscripts are sent to two reviewers, in general. The Editor decides on acceptance or rejection of the manuscripts.

The Editor-in chief sends the review version of the manuscript and the comments of reviewers accompanied by the assessment of the Editor to the authors. In the case of recommended

revision of the manuscript authors have to include their corrections into the file which is sent back by the Editor along with the result of the evaluation process. Authors must respond to the letter of the Editor within 4 weeks, else the manuscript will be finally rejected. When submitting the revised version of the manuscript authors have to hand in also a detailed description of all changes they introduced. Authors will be informed about the final assessment of their manuscript as soon as possible.

Authors receive a form together with the confirmation of acceptance of their manuscript, where the invoice address has to be given. Authors may also give particulars like project codes. Furthermore, authors have to indicate whether VAT may be included or has to be excluded (only authors not from Germany). The further processing of the manuscripts starts only after receipt of the form by the Editor.

For publishing of accepted manuscripts a handling fee (Page Charge) of € 15.00 per manuscript page has to be paid. Authors will receive the invoice directly from the Publisher Eugen Ulmer. The finalization of the manuscript and the publication on the homepage of the Journal will only be done after receipt of the invoice amount. After receiving the invoice authors may speed up the publishing by paying with credit card (Master, Visa). For the fast, simple and secure payment an online-form is at your disposal. Waving of the page charge is not possible.

Form of the manuscripts

1. Manuscripts have to be submitted by email to the Editor-in chief, currently Prof. Dr. Michael Grashorn (email: michael.grashorn@uni-hohenheim.de). The manuscript has to be prepared on DIN A4 pages with margins of 2.5 cm and 1 1/2 space between lines in letter size 12 point.
2. The number of manuscripts is not limited. Nevertheless, in justified cases the Editor may request a shortening of the manuscript. All tables, figures (diagrams), and the list of references have to be included in the numbering of pages.
3. Original papers should usually be divided into the following sections: Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, Summary, Keywords, Zusammenfassung, Stichworte and References. The significance of the results for poultry breeding and keeping should be emphasized in the discussion. For non-German authors translations of title, headings of tables and figures, summary, and keywords will be done by the Editor.
4. Names of the authors cited in the text have to be written in CAPITALS.
5. The name(s) of the author(s) (initials of the first names for men, write the full for women) are written under the title. The name(s) and the location(s) of the institution(s) where the work has been carried out have to be quoted directly below the names of authors without street names and city codes.
6. The complete address of the author for correspondence (author or co-author) including email address must be given after the list of references.

7. Shortcuts are only allowed if internationally used. Energy contents of diets have to be given as MJ metabolizable energy (ME) and reference or formula for calculation must be provided.
8. Tables, figures and legends of illustrations have to be enclosed on separate pages at the end of the manuscript.
9. A short running title of the paper has to be given.
10. Lines of the manuscript have to be numbered continuously.

Figures and Tables

1. Results may be presented either in form of tables or figures. Double presentation for the same results has to be omitted.
2. Numbers have to be given as follows: numbers < 1 with 3 decimals, numbers > 1 and < 10 with 2 decimals, numbers > 10 and < 100 with 1 decimal, numbers > 100 without decimals.
3. Diagrams should be enclosed as Word, PowerPoint or Excel files.
4. Digital images should have a colour density of at least 300 dpi.
5. For images all current formats can be used (also with Macintosh).

Literature

1. Only essential and commonly accessible literature should be cited, e.g. books, articles in journals, and PhD theses on the same subject (no diploma works).
2. Citation of references has to be restricted to most recent ones. Authors are requested to check previous issues of the Journal European Poultry Science for suitable publications on the topic.
3. The name(s) of the author(s) should be written in CAPITALS.
4. The cited references are listed at the end of the paper in alphabetical order by the first author. In the text references are presented by name of the author(s) and year of publication (e.g. JEROCH et al., 2011).
5. When citing publications from journals, the following sequence applies: all authors (with initials of the first names) – year of publication complete title of the publication – journal – volume number (bold) – (issue number if necessary) – page numbers of the publications. Example: HIPPENSTIEL, F., A.A.A. ABDEL-WARETH, S. KEHRAUS, K.-H. SÜDEKUM, 2011: Effects of selected herbs and essential oils, and their active components on feed intake and performance of broilers – a review. Arch. Geflügelk. **75**, 226-234.
6. Books are cited as follows: author (with initials of the first names) year of publication – complete title of the book – edition (from the 2. edition on) – publisher – place ISBN or ISSN – pages. Example: JEROCH, H., S. DÄNICKE, 2011: Faustzahlen der Geflügel-fütterung. In: DAMME, K., C. MÖBIUS: Geflügeljahrbuch 2012. Eugen Ulmer KG, Stuttgart, ISBN 978-3-8001-7585-7, 160-199.

7. For the first author the abbreviated first name is given after the name and for further authors preceding the names. Between the last but one and the last author 'and' has to be omitted.
8. Usually the title of a paper should be cited in the original language. Languages with own characters (e.g. Russian, Arabic, Japanese) should be cited in English translation.

Granting of Rights

1. With the submission of the manuscript, the author gives his/her assurance that he/she has sole disposal over the copyright to his/her article, including any figures and other reproductions, and that the article does not infringe any third-party rights.
2. For all known uses and all uses that may become known in future, and for the duration of the copyright, the author grants the publisher unlimited rights in terms of space and content for any reproduction, distribution, editing (publishing right [Verlagsrecht]) and other use of the article in a material or immaterial form. The publisher is not obliged to make use of the article. After five years have passed since the publication of the article, the author is granted the non-exclusive right to make use of the article him-/herself.
3. The granting of rights according to No. 2 comprises the following use rights of the article in particular: a) translation into other languages, including Braille; b) partial or complete pre-printing or reprinting, also in the form of a special publication; c) reproduction and distribution on audio and/or visual media, and their public playback; d) reproduction and distribution on machine-readable data carriers (CD-ROM, DVD); e) electronic uploading, storage and archiving in the publisher's own or other online database, in order to make the article publicly available to any number of users, including granting the right to third parties to download and print out the article either in part or in full, for a fee or at no charge; f) to index the article, including the possibility of providing key words for an electronic text search and other electronic research functions; g) to reproduce and make the article accessible - including at no charge - as part of electronic book search programs (e.g. LIBREKA, Amazon Search Inside the Book and Google Book Search), including the granting of the right to third parties to research within the article and partially or completely to download the article and print it out, for a fee or at no charge; h) to reproduce and distribute the article by photomechanical or similar means, including the use as part of a copy dispatch by order; i) to use the article or excerpts thereof, and also text and images of the author for the publisher's own advertising purposes; j) editing of the article in accordance with a) to i) above, including the right to draft abstracts and the inclusion of the publisher's and other advertisements; k) to issue licences to third parties for the exercising of rights according to a) to j); and l) all other rights of utilising companies, insofar as granting these rights is legal.
4. The publisher may issue licences with respect to use rights without requiring the prior consent of the author. If a licence right expires owing to the expiration of the underlying use right of the publisher, the author is obliged to permit the licence holder the use for the term agreed to the licence holder and under the conditions that have existed hitherto. The granting of rights to the publisher is remunerated by the payment of the fee. If an unknown

use type is adopted, Art. 32c of the German Copyright Act [UrhG] shall apply. For licences that the publisher issues to third parties in accordance with No. 3, the author shall receive 20%- 50% of the respective net earnings of the publisher from the use of the article.

Honorarium/Reprints

Instead of a royalty authors will receive a PDF document of their paper. Reprints are not available any longer. German-speaking authors are requested to conclude a cognition contract with the Verwertungsgesellschaft WORT, Untere Weidenstraße 5, 81543 München, Germany.

Internet appearance

More information on the Journal "European Poultry Science" (Archiv für Geflügelkunde) is displayed on the Homepage of the Journal (www.european-poultry-science.com). Interested people will find there the guidelines for authors and the contents and abstracts of the last issue, as well as of the volumes back till 2002 (Vol. 66). The full text of the papers since 2002 can be downloaded.

In general, all papers can be downloaded free of charge two years after the publication. Articles published within the last two years are only available for subscribers.

Submission of manuscripts

Manuscripts can only be submitted by email. Acknowledgement of receipt of manuscripts as well as letters of acceptance and the whole correspondence will exclusively be sent by email. Authors can follow the current state of their manuscript on the homepage of the Journal (www.european-poultry.science.com) by using the manuscript identification number under the link manuscript processing.

Authors will receive a draft version of their paper before setting of their manuscript on the homepage authors where mistakes can be corrected which might have occurred during processing. Extended corrections caused by authors will be charged to the author at a rate of € 52.00 per hour.
