Information for Authors

Scope of the journal

- **Journal of Perinatal Medicine** publishes original papers and reviews on all aspects of obstetrical and neonatal research and provides rapid publication for all items of articles:
- **Review articles** providing a coverage of theoretical and practical points of view in a particular field (only after previous arrangement): Manuscript: length according to previous arrangement. References should be limited to max. 50 citations.
- **Original contributions** reporting on new results, particularly from the clinical and experimental areas. Manuscript: approx. 8 pages. Abstract: approx. 200 words. References should be limited to max. 35 citations.
- **Short communications** – rapid publication of new/preliminary results. Manuscript: maximum 3 pages, 1 figure, 1 table. Abstract. References should be limited to max. 10 citations.
- **Opinion papers** – invited statements on themes of topical interest.
- **Technical notes** describing the characteristics of new instruments of methodological improvements. Manuscript: maximum 2 pages, 1 figure.
- **Case reports** will be published completely only online in future, although their abstracts will be included in the print version.
- **Letters of the Editors** – permitting exchange of views and information on controversial topics discussed at conferences and meetings, and comments on previously published material with absolute minimum delay. Manuscript: maximum 1 page.
- **WAPM-Newsletter** – Information of the World Association of Perinatal Medicine.

Review of manuscripts and speed of publication

All contributions submitted for publication are critically reviewed by at least two renowned experts in the field in order to ensure constant high quality of the journal. If both approve the paper it will be accepted for publication and forwarded to the Associate Editors (Prof. Dr. I. Blickstein, Prof. Dr. K. Vetter, Prof. Dr. U. Buescher) for further editorial processing.

Abstracts of meetings can be published at page charges (estimates are available on request).

Guidelines for preparation of manuscripts

Terminology of papers should be clearly understandable even to nontheorists. Manuscripts must be written in clear and concise English and should be regarded as final texts. Illustrations must be submitted in original quality. No changes may be made at the proof state other than correction of printer's errors.

Language of publication

All articles appear in English/American.

Exclusive publication

Submission of a manuscript to *Journal of Perinatal Medicine* implies that the work described has not been published before and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere. Once the manuscript is accepted, it must be not published elsewhere without the consent of the copyright holders.

The Editor must reserve the right to make changes in the layout of individual parts of the manuscript in order to achieve unity and clarity.

• Abstract

An abstract of no more than 200 words should be provided for all types of contributions. It would state the aims, results, and any conclusions drawn.

• Keywords

Up to ten keywords should in alphabetical order be provided on a separate sheet. If possible the keywords should be taken from the Medical Subject Headings of Index Medicus.

• Figures

A reference to each figure is to be given in the text, e.g. (Figure 9) A caption should be provided for each figure in a list of captions. The reproduction of colored figures (as well as black and white reproduction from colored figures) is possible: the cost of reproducing color photographs will be charged to the author at a rate of € 600.– for the first illustration and € 300.– for each subsequent illustration in one article.

• Tables

Tables and their captions should be also numbered in sequence with Arabic numerals (Table 1).

• Literature citations

A. Reference within text:

References should be expressed as follows:

- Either as numbers [in square brackets] pertaining to the respective papers within the reference list (a) or under the author's name followed by the respective number in the reference list (b).
 a. "As several authors [4, 17, 21] have reported ..."
 b. "As Smith [14] and Windus [21] have reported ..."

B. Reference list:

The reference list containing all authors mentioned in the text, should be arranged in alphabetical order and numbered accordingly. The original title of every paper must be given in full and in the original language; abbreviations of periodical names should conform to those used in Index Medicus, National Library of Medicine. The style and punctuation of references should follow the format illustrated by the following examples:

Journal article:

[1] Smith A, AB Jones, CD Hansen: Approach to the patient with hypertension. *Perspect Biol Med* 14 (1971) 578

Book:

[2] Greenhill JP: *Obstetrics*. Saunders, Philadelphia–London 1966

Edited book:

[3]†Auer LM, G Leb, G Tscherne, W Urdl, GF Walter (eds): *Prolactinomas*. Walter de Gruyter, Berlin–New York 1985

Chapter in a book:

When there is more than one author, please cite as follows:

[1] Smith A, B Jones, C Johnson ...

As a rule, manuscripts (including illustrations) are disposed of after publication. If you wish material to be returned, please specify so and give mailing address.

Checklist

Please read carefully before preparing manuscript and recheck all points after it has been prepared. Each manuscript must be accompanied by a completely filled-out checklist. A photocopy of this may be used (Fax: +49-30-26005-298).

General

- References identified in the text by the author's names followed by the respective number in the reference list in square brackets (e. g., Smith [1]) or by the number alone (e. g., "as several authors [1, 4, 7] have reported")
- Reference is made in the text to all figures and tables
- Language polished by a native English speaker
- Authors' full names and institutions
- Short title for the running head

Keywords

- According to Index Medicus, Medical Subject Headings, if possible
- Maximum of 10

Abstract

- Includes aims, methods, results, and conclusions
- Does not include footnotes or references
- Maximum of 200 words

Reference list

- Includes only references cited in the text
- Includes all references cited in the text
- Arranged alphabetically and numbered in this order
- Style and punctuation according to the following examples:

Journal article:

Book:

[2] Schinzel A: Catalogue of unbalanced chromosome aberrations in man. Walter de Gruyter, Berlin-New York 1983

[3] Voth, D, P Glees, J Lorber (eds): Spina bifida - neural tube defects. Walter de Gruyter, Berlin-New York 1986

Chapter in a book:

[4] Gumerlock MK, EA Neuwelt: Principles of chemotherapy in brain neoplasia. In: Jellinger K (ed): Therapy of malignant brain tumors. Springer-Verlag, Wien-New York 1987

When there is more than one author, cite as follows:

[1] Smith, A, B Jones, C Johnson ...

Abbreviations according to Index Medicus

Citations of journal articles in press include journal title, volume, and year in which it is to appear; books in press include publisher and year

List of captions

Include all legends and explanations

Table

Numbered with Arabic numerals in the order of appearance in the text

Each contains all information needed to be understood independently (without the text)

Do not contain data which could be included easily in the text

Do not contain vertical lines

Figures

Numbered with Arabic numerals in the order in which they appear in the text

Contain only clear and sharp lettering or identifying marks; critical areas of X-rays and photomicrographs well-marked

No legends or explanations in the figures themselves
