## AIMS AND SCOPE

The *Journal of Cancer Education*, the official journal of the American Association for Cancer Education (AACE) and the European Association for Cancer Education (EACE), is an international, quarterly journal dedicated to the publication of original contributions dealing with the varied aspects of cancer education for physicians, dentists, nurses, students, social workers, and other allied health professionals, patients, and the general public. Articles featured include reports of original results of educational research, as well as discussions of current problems and techniques in cancer education. Manuscripts are welcome on such subjects as educational methods, instruments, and program evaluation. Suitable topics include teaching of basic science aspects of cancer, the assessment of attitudes toward cancer patient management, the teaching of diagnostic skills relevant to cancer, and the evaluation of undergraduate, postgraduate, or continuing education programs. Letters to the Editor (600 words or less) dealing with published articles or matters of current interest are invited. Also featured: commentary; book and media reviews; and announcements of educational programs, fellowships, and grants.

## INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Only *original* material, not previously published nor under consideration by another publisher, will be reviewed for possible publication. Accepted manuscripts become the property of the AACE and may not be published elsewhere without written permission from the editor. Manuscripts are subject to editorial revision. The author is responsible for the accuracy of all factual material, including changes made by copy editors.

## MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

An original and 3 copies of each manuscript, double-spaced and typewritten on 8½ × 11-inch white paper, and 3 copies of each illustration, should be sent to:

After all revisions have been made, the revised manuscript, including tables and figures, should be transmitted to the editor. The manuscript as revised should be submitted as hard copy and also on floppy (or ZIP) disk.

**Copyright Release.** A statement must be signed by all authors which says, "In consideration of the American Association for Cancer Education's taking action in reviewing and editing my submission, the author(s) undersigned hereby transfers, assigns, or otherwise conveys all copyright ownership to the AACE in the event that such work is published in the *Journal of Cancer Education*."

**Initial Pages.** The title page should state the title, which should be brief and specific, and a running title. Another page should include all authors, with their academic degrees. Affiliations of the authors, hospital or academic institution and city where the work was done; sources of financial support and/or acknowledgments; name, address and telephone number of contact person; and mailing name and address for correspondence and reprint requests should appear at the bottom of the page.

**Abstract.** A 75–100 word abstract, typed double-spaced on a separate sheet, should be included. It should be factual, rather than descriptive, covering the main points, results, and conclusions of the paper. A structured abstract is required for research articles and recommended for others if the subject matter is appropriate. Subdivisions are: Background; Methods; Results; Conclusions.

**Text.** If appropriate, papers should be organized in the following format: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion. Other descriptive paragraph headings and subheadings should be used when appropriate. Every effort should be made to avoid jargon, to spell out all nonstandard abbreviations the first time they are mentioned (followed by the abbreviation in parentheses), and to present the contents of the study as clearly and concisely as possible.

**Tables.** Tables should be typed double-spaced on separate pages of 8½ × 11-inch white bond paper. The table number (Arabic) should be followed by a brief specific title. Tables should be numbered consecutively with respect to citation in the text. The data should be self-explanatory and

should supplement, not duplicate, the text. Acknowledgments for previously published material should be included with *written permission* from the publisher. The source should be included in the reference list with the reference number cited in the acknowledgment.

**Illustrations.** Line drawings, graphs, and charts should be high-contrast black and white, professionally drawn and lettered. Lettering should be of a size that will be compatible with the text type. Figure legends, numbered consecutively, should be typed double-spaced on a separate sheet.

## STYLE

**Sources.** Manuscripts are to be prepared according to the *AMA Manual for Authors and Editors* (American Medical Association, Chicago). Either Webster's *Third New International* or *New Collegiate Dictionary* may be used for spelling and hyphenation of American nonmedical terms. Abbreviations may be used for terms appearing frequently in the text, but should be spelled out at first citation, with the abbreviation following in parentheses. Numbers from one through ten are spelled out only for general usage; numerals are used for all units of measure and time (except years, months, weeks, days, hours, and minutes).

**References.** References should be typed double-spaced and numbered consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text, *not alphabetically*. References in the text, tables, and legends are identified by Arabic numerals and are typed in parentheses. The authors are responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the references.

For journal articles the following information should be included: (1) all author names unless there are more than three, in which case the names of the first three authors are used, followed by "et al." (surnames followed by initials without periods); (2) the title of the article with the first word only capitalized; (3) the journal title abbreviated as it appears in the *Index Medicus* or spelled out if it is not listed there; (4) the year of publication; (5) the volume number (and issue number in parentheses if consecutive pagination is not used); (6) inclusive page numbers.

For books, the chapter authors, chapter title, editors of the book, title of the book (including volume and edition number), publisher's city and name, year of publication, and appropriate page numbers should be included:

## REVIEW AND PRODUCTION PROCESS

Manuscripts are examined by the Editor-in-Chief and at least two reviewers. Decisions of the Editor-in-Chief are final. Authors will receive page proofs of their article before publication, and should answer all questions and carefully check all editorial changes at this point. Reprints may be ordered directly from the publisher. An order form will be sent with the page proofs.
