Preparation of Manuscripts

Manuscripts should be typewritten double-spaced using only one side of the page. Margins should be about 1.5 inches or 3 cm on each side.

Each manuscript should contain a cover page (page 1), with the title, author(s), and their institutional affiliation. At the bottom of this page a complete address (with phone-, fax- and/or E-mail number if available) should be typed for the author who will be responsible for receiving correspondence regarding the manuscript (and later the proofs). On a separate page (page 2) should appear:

An abstract, not to exceed 250 words;
after the Abstract: key words - no more than five words (in alphabetical order), suitable for indexing and electronic search.

The text should be prepared to conform to the general margin guidelines identified above. Avoid the use of footnotes and end notes.

Tables, charts, graphs, and maps should each appear on a separate page; they should not be inserted in the text. Indicate in the text only the preferred location of each of inserting 'Table x about here'. Each table, figure, etc. should be numbered with Arabic numerals. If the material is not original, but derived from another source, a citation to the source should be provided at the bottom using the citation format given below. Citations in the text should be given in parentheses: (last name of author year: pages). If there is more than one citation in a given place these should be presented within a single set of parentheses and proceed from the recently published to the earliest published. An ampersand (&) should be used in place of 'and' for a citation with more than one author appearing inside the parentheses, but 'and' should be used for a citation outside the parentheses.
