

## OBJECTIVES AND GENERAL INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

### Objectives and Scope

*Contemporary Economic Policy (CEP)* strives: i) to communicate results of high-quality economic analysis to policymakers; ii) to focus high-quality research and analysis on current policy issues of widespread concern; iii) to increase awareness among economists of aspects of the economy key to understanding the impact of policy; and iv) to advance policy analysis methodology. We prefer articles that will be widely read and cited, and economic analyses with an impact on policy choices, rather than papers filling a narrow niche.

### Impact Factor and Distribution

*CEP* has an impact factor of 0.482 and is ranked 89/166 in the "Economics" category, and 11/24 in the "Public Administration" category of the *ISI Journal Citation Reports* (2003). Print circulation in 2003 reached approximately 1,700 individuals and more than 500 institutions worldwide.

### Categories of Articles

All submissions are reviewed for quality, creativity, originality, accuracy, and contribution to policy decision-making. The categories of articles separate the audiences along a gradient of analytical content. **Short articles and "Notes" are welcome in each category.**

- ***Economic Analysis of Policy Issues:*** Essays analyzing specific policy issues are critiqued by two or three outside referees. Criteria is weighted toward quality of exposition *and* importance of the issue. Essays in this category should be accessible to policy makers without compromising analytical rigor. Maximum 5000 words.
- ***Surveys:*** Surveys of important general subject areas are critiqued by three outside referees. Criteria is weighted toward importance of the subject, clarity of exposition, and the importance of the contribution. Surveys may be directed toward policy makers or an audience with analytical sophistication. Maximum 8000 words.
- ***Methods and Results for Policy Analysis:*** Research articles devoted to developing new methods for policy analysis are critiqued by two or three outside referees. This category includes articles contributing to fundamental theoretical issues or empirical findings regarding economic relationships that underpin policy choices. Criteria is weighted toward originality *and* potential utility. Maximum 8000 words.

### General Submission Information

Incomplete submissions will be delayed! Initial manuscript submissions **do not** need to conform to *CEP Style Guidelines*. Together with **two double-spaced copies** of your manuscript, please include a cover sheet with the following:

1. Complete contact information for **corresponding author** and all **co-authors**.
2. At least one **JEL classification code** for your manuscript.
3. A statement verifying that the manuscript is **not under review elsewhere and will not be submitted to another publication** while under review at *CEP*.
4. Your **submission fee** of \$90 for WEA International members; \$100 for nonmembers. We accept Visa and MasterCard. Checks must be in U.S. dollars *and* drawn on a U.S. bank made payable to WEA International.

### Conference Paper Submission Information

Manuscript submission fees are waived for WEA International members who submit a revised conference paper within six months of the conference. Your manuscript should incorporate the constructive criticism received at the conference. Please include a cover sheet containing the information requested above under "*General Submission Information*."
