

## Guide to contributors

The editors welcome submissions of relevance to Southern Africa and dealing with human rights, legal philosophy, constitutional and administrative law, freedom of information, law and development and public international law. Submissions taking an interdisciplinary and/or empirical approach to these subjects are particularly encouraged.

Submissions to the SAJHR should comply with the following requirements:

- the submission must be an original, unpublished work and should not simultaneously be submitted for publication elsewhere.

- article submissions should not, in general, exceed 12 000 words (including footnotes). Article submissions must be accompanied by a paragraph-length abstract.

- shorter submissions (fewer than 4000 words) are usually considered for the Cases and Comments section or for the Current Developments section of the Journal.

- the manuscript should be submitted by email in the form of a file attachment in any version of WordPerfect or Word or any ASCII-based word-processing program to the following address: [sajhr@law.wits.ac.za](mailto:sajhr@law.wits.ac.za)

- submissions sent by post must be accompanied by a floppy disk containing the submission in any version of WordPerfect or Word or any ASCII-based wordprocessing program.
