HITCHCOCK AND GRONQUIST'S *Flora of the Pacific Northwest*, first published in 1973, became an instant classic for its authoritative information, innovative style of providing species descriptions in the identification keys, and extensive illustrations of nearly all treated species, subspecies, and varieties. For decades, students have relied on it as an essential primer, while veteran botanists and natural resource managers have used it as the definitive reference for the region's flora.

This completely updated edition captures the latest advances in vascular plant systematics, together with significant changes in plant nomenclature, description of taxa from the region that are new to science, and recent documentation of both native and nonnative species in the Pacific Northwest. Covering all of Washington, the northern half of Oregon, Idaho north of the Snake River Plain, the mountainous portion of western Montana, and the southern region of British Columbia, it includes all wild-growing native and introduced vascular plants falling within those boundaries.

With descriptions of 5,335 taxa and illustrations for 4,716 taxa, *Flora of the Pacific Northwest* is the most comprehensive and authoritative reference on Pacific Northwest vascular plants for professional and amateur botanists, ecologists, rare plant biologists, plant taxonomy instructors, land managers, nursery professionals, and gardeners.

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
