This volume depicts a remarkable selection of creatures, ranging from common and well-known species such as the Spring Peeper, Northern Leopard Frog, and American Toad to a plethora of lesser-known treefrogs, spadefoots, narrowmouth toads, tailed frogs, and neotropical frogs. Superb photographs, high-quality field recordings, and informative text combine to make this a must-have book for every naturalist.
