James D. Watson is best known for his discovery of the structure of DNA, for which he shared the 1962 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine with Frances Crick and Maurice Wilkins. He is the author of the bestseller, *The Double Helix: A Personal Account of the Discovery of the Structure of DNA*, and a half dozen other books on DNA. He is currently the president of Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, which is the leader in the fields of cancer research, plant molecular biology, cell biochemistry, and neuroscience. Dr. Watson has received numerous honors including the National Medal of Science awarded to him by President Clinton in 1997, and the Presidential Medal of Freedom awarded ten years earlier. In 2002 he was made an Honorary Knight of the British Empire.

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
