

## About the Cover

*Lima Scabra* may also be called rough file clams or flame scallops. These scallops have a bright red mantle with red or white tentacles, and can be found in the Caribbean. Some scallops such as the *Lima Scabra*, live unattached, and can swim for short distances by rapidly ejecting water from the mantle cavity and clapping the valves. The valves are also used to escape predators, such as crabs and shrimp.

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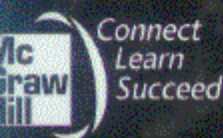
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
